## MEXICANS DUE FOR LABOR TOMORROW

The 320 Mexican nationals assigned to this section for the Bartlett pear harvest starting next Monday in many orchards, are due to arrive late Saturday from eastern Oregon and upstate points.

German prisoners of war, ac-

ording to Robert K. Norris, of the labor committee, will start picking pears early next week. Five hundred have been assigned here. They will work in the field only, as under army rules they are not permitted to be employed in packing houses. County Agent R. G. Fowles, who has been studying methods of handling prisoner workers in Nyssa sugar beet fields, is due back Saturday.

Chairman Norris reports the labor situation as "fair." Packers report a scarcity of local labor.

## Wall Street

New York, Aug. 10 (UP)—Stocks and bonds turned irregularly lower today after a strong opening in response to Japan's offer to accept the Potsdam ultimatum. Commodity prices declined.

In London the reaction of the news, which came when brokers were at lunch, sent prices of stocks and bonds higher with greatest emphasis on far eastern issues, including Chinese and

Japanese sterling bonds and shares of the Hong Kong Shanghai Banking Corp. Gains were maintained at the close, despite profit-taking.

On the New York stock exchange selling got under way in the rails. Aircrafts were also heavily sold.

Motors, which would benefit from cessation of war production, showed rallying attempts. Steels, softened. Building equipments were firm. Merchandising shares showed late gains ranging to a point in Woolworth and Sears Roebuck.

Preliminary closing Dow-Jones stock averages: Industrial 165.14, up 0.59; railroads 56.24, off 1.56; utility 32.51, off 0.05; 85 stocks 62.45, off 0.36.

Sales totaled 1,690,000 shares, the most since June 29, compared with 1,460,000 yesterday.
