ALL THE TIRED OLD MEN

In the book on Defective Mem-
ory, Absent - Mindedness and
their Treatment, published by F.
A. Davis Co., when you and
I were young, Maggie, Dr.
Arnold Lorand, of Carls-
bad, Czechoslovakia, refers to
a patient in a clinic in Vien-
na who became ill and desired
to go home but couldn't re-
member her address. The doctor
gave her an inhalation of amyl
nitrite, and in a few minutes the
patient was able to remember
her address. Amyl Nitrite, like
nitroglycerin (glyceryl trinitrate)
tablet dissolved in the mouth
produces prompt flushing of
face and head. With return of
more blood to the brain centers
the patient recovered her mo-
mentarily lost memory.

The forgetfulness character-
istic of advancing age becomes
noticeable in some persons as
nearly as does graying of the
hair in some persons or dryness
of the skin in others. Dr. Lorand,
in his other book "Life Shortening
Habits and Rejuvenation" pub-
lished by Davis in '25, ascribes
premature grayness and loss of
hair, accumulation of flabby
slacker flesh without actual ex-
cessive intake of food, and the
premature appearance of wrin-
kles and creases in the skin, las-
titude, impaired memory, and a
yellowish dryness of the skin
specifically to the thyroid gland
failure, that is, functional defi-
ciency of the thyroid. That's all.
If you are curious to learn more
there is only one authority to
consult—your own physician.
I'll say just this: In my judgment
every one who is, looks or feels
prematurely old should be sure
to get an adequate daily intake
of iodine. Instructions for this
are given in the pamphlet "Iodin
Ration," mailed on request (no
clipping, please) if you enclose
stamped envelope bearing your
