QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Building Blood. I am asking if you have any instructions on how to build blood. I have now given five pints of blood to the Red Cross blood bank, and while I enjoy perfect health, I suppose I ought to try to keep my blood built up. (Mrs. W. E. J.)

Answer—Generally the donor's blood is up to full strength within two weeks after a donation, without doing anything about it. However, you may find some practical information in booklet "Blood and Health," for copy of which send ten cents and stamped self-addressed envelope.

Children Should Have Pets. Daughter aged 3 very fond of animals, so I got her a kitten. In playing with the kitten she gets fur on face and hands. Friends say a cat is likely to communicate various diseases to children. (Mrs. E. K.)

Answer—Every child should have a pet—cat, dog, pony, goat, duck, rabbit, whatever the child likes, including road, lizard, snake. Teach the child to be gentle and careful in handling the pet AND to wash hands with soap and water immediately after handling the pet.

SEWING MACHINE HEIRESS TO WED

Reno, Nev., Aug. 23—(U.P.)—A rangeland romance will be culminated late today at the Classy El Reno Rancho when Irene Van Heusen Bihn of New York, heiress to the Singer sewing machine and Van Heusen shirt treasures, stamps the brand of matrimony on Cowboy Norman Ferreira of Nevada.

By this act Miss Van Heusen, who was divorced here yesterday from Robert MacDonald Bihn, crosses up the experts who predicted she would follow her usual procedure by re-marrying Bihn, whom she has sued three and divorced twice since their maiden voyage in 1936.

Now it makes no difference at all, so far as we know, in what form the daily ration of iodine is taken, organic or inorganic, elemental iodine or iodine in chemical combination, iodine as it occurs naturally in fish or shellfish from the sea, in sea weed, in fruit or vegetables grown on soil that contains iodine or on soil that has been fertilized with iodides or with fish meal or with sea weed, drinking water that naturally contains iodine or to which iodide has been added—only so one gets the amount of iodine required to maintain good nutrition and good metabolism.

Probably enough in a serving of canned salmon or a shrimp cocktail or a fillet of halibut to fill the body's requirement for a few days. Nutrition authorities estimate that the daily requirement is from 50 to 200 micrograms of pure elemental iodine, and there are approximately 65,000 micrograms in a grain (I can't guarantee my arithmetic, but anyway a wee bit of iodine goes a long way in nutrition).

In the "Iodine Ration" pamphlet, available on request if you provide stamped self addressed envelope, instructions have been simplified so that there need be no more confusion regarding various strengths of iodine or percentages of alcohol or "poison" labels. What I call "Iodine Ration" has only one strength, no alcohol, and of course no "poison" label.

LADY ARRAIGNED FOR BANK FRAUD

San Francisco, Aug. 23—(U.P.)—Gloria Hitt Johnson, 22-year-old former teller at the Lincoln National Bank in Washington, D. C., today was arraigned on a charge of conspiring to defraud the bank of \$9,000.

Mrs. Johnson was arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation yesterday. A Washington, D. C., complaint charged her with furnishing ledgers and signatures from the Lincoln Bank to her husband, Raymond, and a Billy Korban who used them in an attempt to forge checks.
