

FIRST ARMY MAY TAKE PART HONG KONG OCCUPATION

Chungking, Aug. 24 (UP)—The future status of the British crown colony of Hongkong today dominated discussions in official and unofficial Chinese government circles.

It was believed that the initial reoccupation of Hongkong would be carried out by Chinese forces under Gen. Chang Fah Kwei and the American-trained new first army.

While British military and diplomatic authorities in Chungking maintained complete silence, it was also thought that British naval units which had been reported en route to Hongkong a few days ago might have turned to reoccupy other areas. If these units land at Hongkong, Chinese officials felt they would merely assist Gen. Chang's forces.
