

## FORUM LUNCHEONS WILL HAVE NOTED MEN AS SPEAKERS

Forum luncheons featuring as speakers Palmer Hoyt, publisher of the Portland Oregonian and Harvey Stowers, representing the aircraft industries of America, are being planned by the Jackson county chamber of commerce for later this fall. It was stated Friday noon by President Herb

Grey, who introduced Representative Harris Ellsworth to 100 members and guests of the chamber meeting at the Hotel Holland. Dispensing with the regular chamber of commerce director's business session, Congressman Ellsworth was presented and addressed the group on phases of his work in the nation's capital. No proof of immediate unemployment problems were seen by Ellsworth, who said that industry is reconverting back to peacetime manufacturing rapidly and efficiently.

Ellsworth suggested the possibility of installation of a plant in southern Oregon for production of wood alcohol from sawdust, similar to the plant being completed at Springfield, Ore.

late this fall. High protein value feeding yeast is also being developed from the sawdust, he added. Chemicals and plastics are being made from other wood waste products, offering hope of further utilization of northwest timber, where only 30 per cent of that logged is actually used now.

The congressman talked Friday morning with E. P. Leavitt, superintendent of Crater Lake National Forest, and reported that he will work in Washington to have the park reestablished as a year-round vacation area, as in pre-war days. For the past few seasons, the lake road has been opened only in summer.

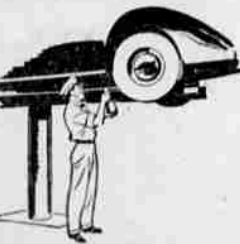
