POLAR COLD CO. BUILDING NEW LOCKER PLANT

To help meet the local demand for more individual cold storage lockers, the Polar Cold Co. is starting construction of a new locker plant on Hawthorne street, one-half block off East Main. The owners, Harry R. Gould, George Martin and Jerry Young, plan to have the new 500-locker plant ready around September 15.

Young will be manager of the plant. Gould and Martin are well known refrigeration engineers. For the past 12 years Gould has specialized in commercial refrigeration and during the past few months he has inspected nearly every large locker plant on the coast to determine what people want most in locker service.

The Polar Cold lockers, which will be new in design, will offer the greatest convenience to the user both from the standpoint of easy access and the placement of foods. Plans call for a pre-cooling room for meats and a cutting and wrapping room. The owners plan to keep the plant open until 11 o'clock at night.

'STAY ON JOB' IS URGENT PLEA OF RED CROSS UNIT

"Stay on the job" is the official word at headquarters of the Jackson county chapter of the American Red Cross, said Seth Bullis, chapter chairman, when asked yesterday of the chapter's immediate post-war plans.

"V-J Day is here," Bullis said, "but we are making an urgent appeal to all our people to 'stay on the job,' because the services and assistance of the Red Cross are going to be needed now just as much as ever, particularly by the thousands of our fighting men in the occupied areas and in the military and veterans hospitals."

Bullis stated that the wartime efforts of the leaders and workers of the Jackson county chapter were highly commended in a letter just received from Verne Simmons, manager of the American Red Cross Pacific Area headquarters in San Francisco. Simmons also pointed out the

immediate need for 3,000 additional paid social workers, recreation workers and non-professional hospital workers in military hospitals. Military authorities have called on the Red Cross to furnish these workers and the job of recruiting them is now being pushed with all possible speed.

MILNES BOOKLET PLAN APPROVED

Vic Milnes of Medford, treasurer of the Oregon Junior Chamber of Commerce, attended a meeting of the JayCee organizations of Oregon, Washington and Idaho which was held at LaGrande last week-end.

Saturday the states held individual meetings with a joint session on Sunday. The Oregon group completed plans for a state paper and approved a guide book. Milnes, originator of the book, was placed in charge of publication. All Oregon JayCee chapters agreed to participate in a national building fund to raise money for a building to house the U. S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, site of which has not been determined.

It was also decided that the next meeting would be held at Medford in October, 1946.
