## TRUMAN APPROVES M'ARTHUR MEDAL

Okinawa, Aug. 29—(U.P.)—President Truman has approved the award of the Distinguished Service medal to Gen. Douglas MacArthur for his planning and direction of the Philippines campaign, it was announced today. MacArthur already holds the Distinguished Service medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Congressional Medal of Honor, two Distinguished Service Crosses, seven silver stars, two purple hearts, and numerous foreign decorations.

The citation said, "As supreme commander of Allied air, ground, and sea forces in the southwest Pacific, General of the Army Douglas MacArthur planned and personally directed the campaigns which resulted in the liberation of the Philippine Islands.

## SIAMESE TWINS DOOMED TO LIVE TIED TOGETHER

Phoenix, Ariz., Aug. 29—(U.P.)—Louise and Maella Miranda—the only "Siamese twins" in medical history to be joined at the front of their bodies—today were doomed to remain inseparable throughout their probably short lives.

X-Ray reports showed that while the three-day-old girls have separate stomachs and intestines, they have one liver in common and their two intestinal tracks are joined.

Physicians announced previously that the babies could not be severed unless each was anatomically complete and organically independent.

The babies were born Saturday at nearby Coldwater to Mr. and Mrs. Jesus Miranda, with only Mrs. Miranda's mother in attendance. They were taken to St. Monica's hospital here Sunday.

Meanwhile, the twins were eating and crying normally. The Rev. Emmett McLoughlin, O. F. M., superintendent of the hospital, said research disclosed

## CANNING SUGAR BAN IS REMOVED
