

PLANE CRASHES ON JAP ISLAND IN HEAVY STORM

San Francisco, Aug. 30—(U.P.)—An American Superfortress crashed on northern Honshu Tuesday, killing 10 of the 11 crew members, the Japanese news agency Domei said today.

The broadcast, recorded by the FCC, said that the bomber crashed during a raging storm near Tegamura in southern Aki prefecture. The storm prevented a Japanese rescue squad from reaching the scene until Wednesday morning.

Domei said the single survivor, who was seriously burned, is "being given every possible medical treatment."

In an earlier broadcast radio Tokyo said last night that four Allied prisoners of war were killed Tuesday afternoon when they were hit by packages of supplies dropped from low-flying navy planes.

The broadcast, recorded by the FCC, said that one Australian officer and one American soldier were killed at a prisoner of war camp at Hanaoka in northeastern Japan, while one soldier and one patient, unidentified by nationality, were killed on the compound of the Chiba army hospital.

Judge Thurmond Clarke granted the decree on the standard grounds of cruelty after the sable-clad one-time "poor little rich girl" testified she and Actor Grant had nothing in common and never would have.

"It was very embarrassing," she said. "My friends would come to visit us and he would just go upstairs and sit and leave me to make the excuses."

Grant did not contest the action, and under their marriage agreement had waived any

claim to a portion of her \$40,000,000. The marriage, begun with a romantic elopement to Lake Arrowhead, Calif., July 8, 1942, at first was believed idyllic, but soon came to a separation "without hope of reconciliation." Seven weeks later they were back together, but split finally on Feb. 26. Miss Hutton moved out of their Bel Air mansion, where even during the course of their previous separation, Grant had had to go through her room to get to his.
