The top baseball attraction of the year comes to Medford Monday night when the Fort Lewis Warriors meet an all-star team composed of players from the Klamath Falls Navy, Klamath Falls Marines and Medford Craters. The Warriors, beaten only once in over 100 games, boast such big league stars as Danny Litwhiler of the Cardinals, Bill Fleming of the Cubs, Red Embree of Cleveland and Don Johnson of the Yankees.

Medford and Central Point meet here Sunday in the last game of the Shaughnessy play-off for consolation honors. Both lost out in the opening round Sunday, Medford falling before the Navy, 20 to 7, and Central Point bowing to the Marines 10 to 9.

Al Simpson, head menter of the Black Tornado football squad, defending state champions, has called the first practice for Sept. 3 when equipment will be issued and a campaign outlined. First game of the season is against Albany here Sept. 21.

About 30 golfers have qualified for the Southern Oregon-Northern California tournament to be played on the Rogue river golf course here, starting with the qualifying round today. The tourney will run through Sept. 3. Eddie Simmons, a consistent winner, will be absent from play because of his health.

Congressman Harris Ellsworth told 100 persons at a Jackson county Chamber of Commerce forum luncheon last Friday that America is being propagandized with threats of immediate unemployment where actually returning servicemen will be absorbed into industry as released, for some time at least. Similar luncheons are planned for the near future with Palmer Hoyt and Harvey Stowers as guests.

Funeral services for Byran M. Yorton, PHM 2/c, who was killed here early Monday morning when his car was sideswiped by an auto driven by Hollie A. Rhoads, were held yesterday and interment was in Siskiyou Memorial park. Yorton enlisted in the navy three years ago and was home on leave after service in the South Pacific.

ALASKA AIR FORCE ON PEACE BASIS, CREWS DUE BACK

Edmonton, Alta., Aug. 31—(UPI)—The Alaskan division of the U. S. army air force's air transport command will immediately revert to a peacetime basis and between 1,800 and 3,000 men will be returned to the United States within a week. Col. H. J. Kieling, deputy division commander, announced yesterday.

The division was started in October, 1942, and since that time has ferried thousands of aircraft and tons of war material to Russia.

Col. Kieling said present plans indicate that eventually the bases of the division stretching from the United States through Canada to Nome, Alaska, would be reduced to seven. Those remaining probably will be at Minneapolis, Minn.; Great Falls, Mont.; Seattle, Wash.; Edmonton, Whitehorse, Yukon Territory and Ladd Field, Fairbanks, he said.

The bases at Calgary, St. John, Watson Lake and Fort Nelson are to be turned over to the Canadian government by Oct. 1, Kieling added.
