

SOCIAL SECURITY AGENT WILL COME HERE REGULARLY

A regular itinerant service for Medford and Ashland has been established by the Klamath Falls office of the Social Security Board and in the future Howard J. Nelson, manager of the office, will spend designated days in this county. The first visit to Medford will be Sept. 12, Mr. Nelson states, and thereafter he will be in the United States Employment office at Medford at 9 a. m. on the second and fourth Wednesday of every month.

Nelson will be at the Council Chamber in Ashland's city hall at 11 a. m. on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month beginning Sept. 11.

Claims Urged
"It is believed that a regular date of call will provide a more adequate service to the residents of Medford, Ashland and vicinities," Nelson states. Individuals desiring to file applications for benefits under old-age and survivors insurance provisions of the Social Security Act, or who merely wish information, are urged to call during these regular scheduled visits of Nelson.

With the nation's Social Security Act starting its second decade, Nelson emphasizes that social security provides a five-program attack on destitution. However, Nelson pointed out that the Klamath board has full responsibility for only program, old-age and survivor's insurance.

Claims Handled
"At our office," he said, "we issue social security account cards, help to straighten out any mistakes that may be made in the wage records of workers, give full information about the old-age and survivors insurance and handle claims for benefits."
"As of June 30, monthly insurance benefits under the old-age and survivors insurance system were being paid to 1,145 men, women and children in our field service area. The payments amounted to \$22,069.39 monthly, a rate of \$264,832.68 a year.

Live Snakes For Funeral Service

Chattanooga, Tenn., Sept. 6—(U.P.)—Mrs. Ressie Ford planned today to pass live snakes around at the funeral of her husband, lay preacher of a religious sect who died Monday of a rattlesnake bite.

The death of Lewis E. Ford, 52, was the second blamed on rattlesnakes used for sect ceremonies over the labor day weekend.

A doctor in Wise, Va., said Mrs. Anna Kirk, wife of rattlesnake-handling preacher, died Monday of bites she received Saturday in a demonstration. Her death came a few minutes after she gave birth to a child. The child also died.

Railroad Schedule Restrictions Off

Washington, Sept. 6—(U.P.)—The Office of Defense Transportation today lifted wartime restrictions on railroad passenger train schedules effective Sept. 16. It is expected to relax the 5-day reservation limit shortly.

An ODT order limiting the use of sleeping cars to trips of more than 450 miles remains in effect. ODT officials have relaxation of this order "under discussion."

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SOLONS PRESS FOR FASTER DISCHARGE

Washington, Sept. 6—(U.P.)—Congressmen continued to press for an end to the draft and faster military discharges today as the army sharply boosted exemptions from future overseas duty.

The army announced last night that it would not send men overseas who had 45 points as of May 12, who were 37 years old or who were 34-36 years old with a minimum of one year's honorable service.

Captain Overmyer Gets Bronze Star For Heroic Action

Capt. Charles Overmyer, son of Col. and Mrs. O. L. Overmyer, 610 South Holly street, has been awarded the Bronze Star medal, according to a message received from Capt. Overmyer's wife in Sparks, Nev.

The medal was awarded by direction of the President for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy at Luzon from Jan. 15 to Jan. 19.

Capt. Overmyer served at Blak, New Guinea, went to Lingayen Gulf with Gen. Douglas MacArthur and saw action at Manila, Sumar and southern Luzon.

Central Pt. Soldier In Truman Escort

Pfc. Edward L. Walter of Central Point was in the military police escort for President Harry S. Truman during the visit of the commander-in-chief to Belgium on his way to Germany for the Big Three meeting, a dispatch from the European theater states. The release states that the military demeanor and smart appearance of the MP's chosen to escort the president added much to the spectacle of his visit, and that their efficiency impressed the presidential party.
