

SAILOR, WOUNDED IN PACIFIC AREA, ADMITS SLAYING

Unfentown, Pa., Sept. 8—(U.P.) The words flowed freely when an 18-year-old discharged sailor confessed the brutal slaying of Anna Elizabeth Dreyer, the "Sunshine Girl" of Fayette City, but the youth broke down today as he faced his soldier brother in a jail cell.

Frederick I. (Red) Hauser had just signed an 11-page confession to the killing of the pretty,

17-year-old Miss Dreyer when his brother, Sgt. Gus Hauser, back from 14 months in a German prison camp, visited him in a Fayette county jail.

Hauser early today confessed that he beat and strangled Miss Dreyer last Saturday morning, abandoning her body, stripped nude in the struggle, in a clump of poison ivy off the Fayette City-Connelville road, six miles from her home.

The youth, who was discharged from the navy after being wounded in a ship explosion in the Pacific, said he beat the girl when she resisted him after once promising to get as he drove her home from a Moneesen restaurant where she was employed as a waitress.

BRITAIN TO SEEK MORE LOAN HELP

London, Sept. 6—(U.P.)—Lord Halifax, Britain's ambassador to the United States, left today for Washington to discuss with American officials the possibility of a lend-lease extension or similar arrangement for Britain, as government officials here worked to strengthen the nation's industrial position and build up her food supply.

An official commentator said Halifax, travelling by air, was scheduled to arrive in Baltimore tomorrow afternoon. He will head a British delegation in economic talks with American officials at Washington.

FINLAND BORDER CLOSED BY REDS

Oglo, Sept. 8—(U.P.)—Soviet authorities have closed the border between Norway and Soviet-controlled areas of Finland to all but persons having formal permission to cross, it was disclosed today by a Norwegian source.

Mat Jacob Schive, a Norwegian member of the Russo-Finnish Boundary Commission who recently returned from Finnmark, in far northern Norway, said the Russian action had ended the formal free and casual passages to and fro across the frontier.

Hop Dryer Burns In G. Pass Area

Grants Pass, Sept. 8—Fire completely destroyed the new, electrically equipped hop-dryer at the W. V. De Armand hop yards on the Lower River road early Friday.

De Armond stated the building, supposedly fire-proof, and about 600 bales of hops in the process of drying and already dried were destroyed by the blaze. Loss was set at approximately \$15,000 by De Armond. Both the building and the crops were covered by insurance, he said.
