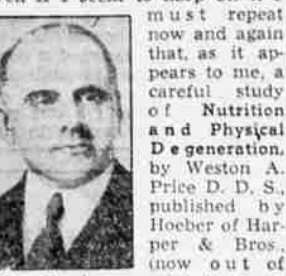

QUESTIONS—ANSWERS
 Nervous indigestion
 For your information storehouse: I have obtained the most remarkable relief from nervous indigestion and spastic colon of years standing after adopting your suggestion of supplementing my diet with 1200 units daily of vitamin B complex. In fact, I believe I am cured. Oddly enough, two years ago a physician gave me daily injections of synthetic B₁ (thiamin) for several weeks, with no apparent benefit. I certainly feel grateful.

Answer—In any case where a single isolated entry of the natural B complex may seem indicated it is better to use the natural B complex, physicians with experience in this field find if the diet has failed to provide enough B₁ (thiamin) it is almost certain that it has failed to provide enough B₂ (riboflavin), nicotinic acid, growth factor, weight factor, anti-glycogen factor, etc., as well. So the deficient diet should be supplemented with not just one but all of the factors of the B complex.

Old Time Specialists Have Their Day

Andrew Florey SENDS MAPS OF SQUAD PROGRESS

Maybe a "specialist" of some sort could do for you, Stu (short for stupid—if I spell it out some stupid people resent it furiously), but if my jawbone (ah, ah, let us dispense with the obvious), tooth sockets, gums and teeth were under the scrutiny of physician, dentist or specialist I wouldn't pay any attention. After all it would make little difference what the physician or dentist might prefer to call the trouble if I had one or more of these symptoms, which Louis I. Grossman, D.D.S., D.M.D., describes as symptoms of pyorrhea alveolaris in The Cyclopaedia of Medicine, Surgery and Specialties, Vol. X, '43:

Diffuse hyperemia (congestion) of gums with inflammation of gums between the teeth, followed later by slight recession of gums.

Gums bleed on slight provocation ("pink toothbrush" to you, Stu)

Pockets form in gums and flinty suppurate. Teeth begin to become loose. Teeth begin to be painful during lateral or grinding movement in chewing. Bad taste in the mouth, especially on rising. Offensive breath.

Spaces between teeth become wider than formerly (the teeth undergoing atrophy).

Some dentists break it gently by saying the trouble is just "gingival irritation" or maybe they call it atrophic gingivitis. Whatever the dentist calls it one may face it sooner or later—it means one is beginning to—now do try to get hold of yourself and understand this pains me just as much, probably more than it does you—beginning to die.

Listen, I mean merely happens to every individual as soon as he or she has attained full growth and development. It is the way of life.

Let us acknowledge before we begin treatment that we can't cure pyorrhea. If you are interested only in a sure cure further discussion is useless—you should go to some quack who canvasses suckers.

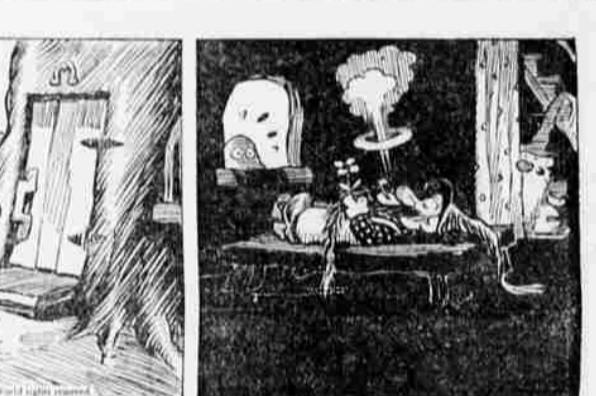
Crossword Puzzle

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Medford, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:00 p. m., October 12, 1945, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 160 acres within Sec. 28, T. 37 S., R. 4 E., W. M., Rogue River National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 1,500,000 feet B. M. more or less, of live and dead white fir, 1,000,000 feet B. M. more or less, of live and dead Douglas-fir, and an unestimated amount of other species of saw timber. No bid of less than \$1.75 per M feet for white fir, \$3.75 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$5.75 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$8.75 per M feet for sugar pine, \$8.75 per M feet for white pine, \$1.75 per M feet for Shasta red fir, and \$1.50 per M feet for incense cedar will be considered. In determining the high bid, the rate for Douglas-fir and white fir only will be considered. Bids with rates in excess of those permissible under MPR 460 will be reduced to the allowable maximum in making the award. In addition to the prices bid for the stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.50 per M feet B. M. to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.25 per M feet B. Succasunna, N. J., Sept. 12—(U.P.)—A controversy raged today as to whether 24-year-old James Hornberger, Jr., Pacific veteran, should resume his education with the 12 and 13-year-olds in the eighth grade at Roxbury Township grammar school.

Hornberger's neighbors said he had no place in a class room with young children. They said the children would have no time for their books because they would find Hornberger and his war exploits too big a diversion.

"The GI bill of rights is behind me," Hornberger said. "I am within my rights, and I need a grammar school diploma before I can go to high school."
