## J. A. CUNNINGHAM FUNERAL SERVICE 10:30 SATURDAY

Funeral services for James Arthur Cunningham, Orchard Home Drive, will be held at the Pepl Funeral Home Saturday at 10:30 a. m. Interment will be in Siskiyou Memorial Park, the Rev. Harry Hansen officiating.

Mr. Cunningham, who passed away at a local hospital September 12, was born at Murrayville, Ill., April 25, 1882, being one of 10 children, and preceded in death by one brother.

In 1906 he moved to Grand Forks, N. Dak., where he was connected with the E. J. Lander real estate firm. He was transferred to the branch office of that firm in Williston, N. Dak., in 1908. On March 22, 1911, he was married to Lotta Luke at Medford, Ore. To this union were born three children, Luke Alexander Cunningham of Miles City, Mont.; Lt. Robert James Cunningham, USNR, Sea Tattle, Wash., and Joan Cunningham, Medford.

In 1927 Mr. Cunningham and associates organized the First National Bank in Williston, and he served as president of this bank until 1943. He also had extensive farming interests in that vicinity. During his residence in Williston he was actively engaged in civic affairs, working continuously for the promotion and growth of western North Dakota, through improved highways, irrigation and commercial airports.

In 1943 he sold his banking interests and a large part of his farming interests and moved to Medford, where he purchased the fruit ranch of Mrs. D. W. Luke, 2½ miles southwest of the city. The deceased was a member of the First Presbyterian church of Medford and the local chapter of Kiwanis.

### Blaze Destroys G. P. Hop Dryer

Grants Pass, Sept. 13—Fire, believed to have originated under the kiln floor, completely destroyed the Raymond Lathrop hop dryer, on the lower River Road near here, Tuesday evening. State forest patrolmen called to the scene were unable to save the building.

Lathrop said approximately 250 bales of dried hops were in the building at the time and estimated the loss at about \$32,000. Both the building and crop were insured.

The Lathrop fire was the third of its kind within a week with total damage estimated at \$133,000.

### Aussies Beheaded By Jap Lieutenant

Sydney, Sept. 13—(UP)—Liberated Australian war prisoners said today that four Australian soldiers were beheaded by a Japanese lieutenant on Ambon Island last April 26 for stealing four bags of rice and nine boxes of tinned fish.

Another Australian was beheaded by a second Japanese lieutenant, the prisoners said on their arrival at Morotai. Altogether, they said, 17 prisoners were executed by various means during the three and a half years of Japanese occupation.
