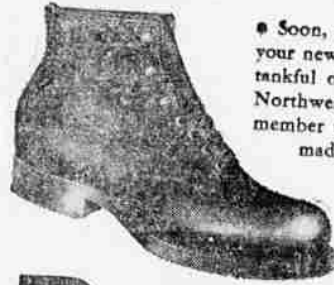


TURNEY SELECTED AS PRESIDENT OF KNIFE, FORK CLUB

Other Speakers Coming

Other speakers considered to complete the first year's program include for October Dr. Vernon Nash, Rhodes scholar from Missouri, founder of the first school of journalism in Asia at Yenching University, Peiping, China, who will discuss "America's Next 100 Years in Asia" and for November Merryle Stanley Rukeyer, reputedly America's highest paid financial writer and sound-money economist, discussing the subject "Post-War Prosperity or Slump—Which?"

No meeting is planned for December but in January the club will have a choice of Dr. Will Durant, world famous philosopher historian speaking on "What Are the Lessons of History," or Bertita Harding, famous woman writer on "Our Latin American Neighbors." February will bring Hawthorne Daniel, writer of nearly 30 books recently returned from four months at sea with the American fleet reporting first-hand on the "New Pacific Empire" or "Geo-

politics from an American Point of View."

For March is scheduled John B. Hughes, popular Pacific coast commentator, with an up-to-date commentary on events of the time and April will bring Dr. Beryl Orris, renowned student of psychiatry, discussing popular psychiatry including juvenile delinquency, mental crack-ups of the armed forces, world disturbances and their reactions to individuals and other phases.

Atom Locomotive Early Objective

Belleville, N.J., Sept. 13—(U.P.)—Construction of an atomically driven railroad locomotive will be begun soon, according to Ralph Lucas, chief engineer of the United States Industrial Research and Development Company, Elmira, N.Y. Lucas said that he had patent on a formula through which the atomic energy of steel and mercury would be harnessed, through a type of turbine, to an experimental engine for the New York Central Railroad. Construction will begin here shortly, he said.

Santiago, Chile, Sept. 13—(U.P.)—An earth shock rocked parts of Chile for about two minutes beginning at 7:16 a. m. today. Six deaths were reported in Santiago when three old houses collapsed. Some power lines were affected.
