CAPTAIN TALBOT PLOTS WEATHER AT TUNIS PORT

Air Transport Command, El Aouina Air Base, Tunis, Tunisia — While Col. Clarence P. Talbot is slapping the Japs somewhere in China his son, Capt. Clarence P. Talbot, Jr., is plotting weather and making the forecasts that are so vital to the planes that fly the air transport command's North African route. Capt. Talbot is based in Tunis, one of the North African division's important stations along the Mediterranean coast.

When victory was established in Europe the ATC began the largest movement of men and materiel in world history. The North African division is a vital highway to victory. Men are moving out of five theaters of war, some to be discharged while others are pressed into service in the Pacific. Simultaneously supplies and ammunition are being rushed to China. Upwards of 40,000 men are passing through Casablanca monthly. Big four-engine C-54 transports, taking off every 15 minutes, carry at least 1,300 men back to "The Land of the Free" daily.

Tunis is an important stop-over between Cairo and Casablanca. Here planes are refueled, passengers and crews fed and necessary maintenance is speedily, but thoroughly, attended to before departure. Capt. Talbot and his men are on hand to give them up-to-the-split-second weather forecasts.

The captain has been overseas 16 months. Before coming overseas, he attended weather school at Chanute Field, Ill., and was later based in Miami Beach and Orlando, Fla. His wife, the former Cheryl Davidson, is living with their son in Medford.

Sgt. Harry Dunlap
S/Sgt. Harry V. Dunlap, 1216 Saling avenue, Medford, is now at the LeHavre Port of Embarcation Staging Area in France awaiting shipment to the United States under the army redeployment program, according to a release from the ETO public relations section. He is the son of Mrs. H. Dunlap of the Medford address.

Capt. Christian Hald
With the Fifth Army, Italy — Capt. Christian Hald, whose wife, Jacque, resides on King's Highway, Medford, is a member of the 361st infantry regiment's third battalion, which recently

was awarded the distinguished unit citation for gallantry, determination and esprit de corps in overcoming unusually difficult and hazardous conditions.

BURGLARS GIVEN TERMS IN PRISON

Robert Eric Rose and Bryson P. Keeney, charged with burglary not in a dwelling, entered pleas of guilty and were each sentenced to intermediate terms not to exceed two years in state prison by Circuit Judge Herbert K. Hanna yesterday.

The pair were accused of breaking and entering Hunter's Drug store last month, taking money and cigarettes. They also were charged with stealing rings from an Ashland waitress and selling them in Klamath Falls.

Floy Loree Perkins, charged with forgery, entered a plea of guilty and was granted a continued sentence while authorities check up on his past record. Perkins is accused of cashing a \$47 spurious check on the Montgomery Ward store.
