Pearl Harbor, Sept. 20 (U.P.)—The aircraft carrier USS Saratoga, 25 CVE escorts and one submarine are transporting American troops to the west coast from the Pacific and may carry a monthly total of 20,000 men, it was announced today. Rear Admiral Henry S. Kendall, head of the division of navy jeep carriers, said if all 27 vessels now carrying troops can haul top loads, the 20,000 monthly figure will be attained. 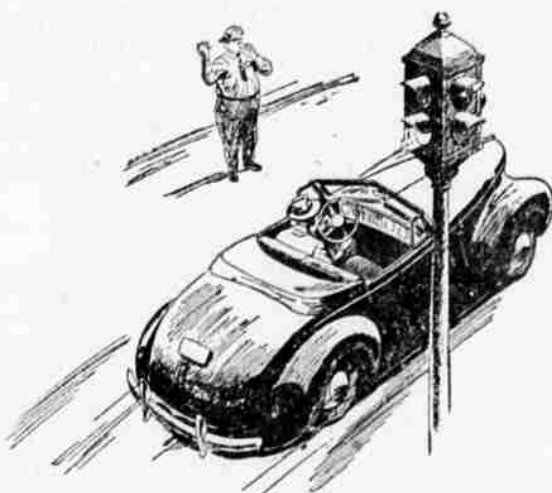
