

**Japs Executed Four
In Soviet Spy Ring
After Secret Trial**

Tokyo, Sept. 20 — (U.P.) — Two foreigners and four Japanese, including the son of a prince attached to Emperor Hirohito's household staff and a member of the imperial diet, were tried late

in 1943 as asserted members of an international soviet spy ring, it was learned today.

A German correspondent for the Frankfurter Zeitung and a representative of the official French news agency Havas were convicted and executed by a firing squad, as were two of the Japanese. They were: Richard Sorge, 48, of the Zeitung.

Francis De Vookerich, 59, assistant correspondent for Havas. Hidemi Ozaki, 43-year-old journalist and author. Yotoku Miyagi, 41-year-old artist.

Involved in charges of supplying information to the espionage ring and jailed for two years but acquitted were:

Keninukai, a member of the present Japanese House of Commons, and son of a former premier assassinated by militarists at the start of the "China incident." Kimochi Saionji, son of Prince Saionji of the Imperial household staff and grandson of the late Prince Kimochi Saionji, last of the Genro and first advisor to the emperor.

The United Press learned that the clique was brought to trial in Tokyo's criminal court in June, 1943, and tried behind closed doors.
