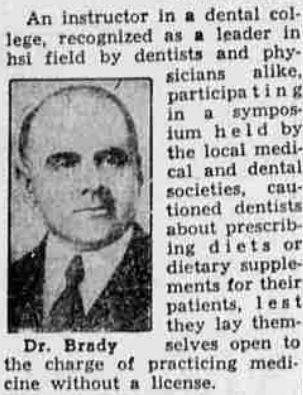

### THE PYORRHEA SPECIALIST

An instructor in a dental college, recognized as a leader in his field by dentists and physicians alike, participating in a symposium held by the local medical and dental societies, cautioned dentists about prescribing diets or dietary supplements for their patients, lest they lay themselves open to the charge of practicing medicine without a license.

That quibble, coming from a representative member of the profession, indicates what is wrong with American dentistry, in my one-horse country doctor opinion, namely, inferiority complex. For all the pretensions of the dentists they themselves are painfully conscious that after all they are not doctors. The remedy for this sad complex is now at hand, but it will take another ten years or so to begin to show an effect—students who plan to practice dentistry are now required to take the full course in medicine first, and then whatever special or technical training may be further required to qualify the M.D. to practice dentistry. Harvard was the first American college to institute this plan— unquestionably other dental schools will have to modernize

their curricula or fold. In future American dentists will be doctors and no fooling.

One presumptive authority, writing on pyorrhea in Vol. 10, The Cyclopedia of Medicine, Surgery and Specialties (Davis Co., '43) becomes carried away by his enthusiasm for the role of "specialist" and orates that "Genuine pyorrhea without a gingival pocket does not exist." Implying, you see, that when we ordinary doctors and dentists fool around with what we imagine is pyorrhea the chances are it is not genuine pyorrhea—if you want to be sure you have the genuine thing you had better disregard these doctors and dentists around here and go straight to a specialist.

Gingival pocket, my eye. Any dentist or doctor who knows the difference between pyorrhea and giant hives must see numerous cases of pyorrhea without gingival pocket or pockets, and it is absurd for any "specialist" to say these are not "genuine."

It is only fair to quote the author's statement more fully: "Genuine pyorrhea without a gingival pocket does not exist. Furthermore, a pyorrhea pocket without pus does not exist. A gingival pocket is, therefore, a necessary accompaniment of pyorrhea. The pocket results as a sequence of alveolar atrophy. It has therefore been said that alveolar atrophy causes pyorrhea. (Alveolar atrophy means wasting of the tooth sockets—bone, gum and all.)

But what causes alveolar atrophy? The answer lies in the causes enumerated above. (Hereditary predisposition, such systematic diseases as malnutrition, diabetes, gout, the presence of salivary calculus, trauma by uneven impact of the teeth during mastication, mechanical irritation by overhanging fillings, ill-fitting dental restorations, etc.) The alveolar atrophy is the first stage . . . followed by pocket formation and suppuration."
