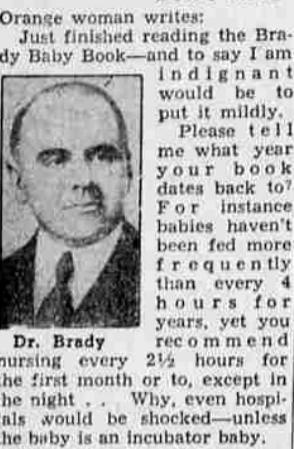

**DON'T MIND THE CREAKS**

Orange woman writes: Just finished reading the Brady Baby Book—and to say I am indignant would be to put it mildly.

Please tell me what your book dates back to? For instance babies haven't been fed more frequently than every 4 hours, yet you recommend nursing every 2 1/2 hours for the first month or so, except in the night. Why, even hospitals would be shocked—unless the baby is in an incubator baby.

Where do you get your authority to print such an exaggerated and untruthful pamphlet? And your description of specialists is criminal.

Now that you have challenged my teaching in this public way, Ma'am, I suppose I must mumble something by way of self-defense.

The Brady Baby Book dates back to 1918. But there have been a good many editions since then, and, believe it or not, correspondents sometimes tell me they were raised on the Brady Baby Book and now they are raising their own kids by the same book.

This Ma'am, is not rebuttal, for you have given no evidence but merely your opinion. I am merely explaining the creaks and rattles your hypersensitive ear detects as we drive along.

Let's leave the "specialists" out of this discussion. I do not abate one jot or tittle what I say about real specialists and trick specialists in the Brady Baby Book—and people with enough sense to understand what I'm talking about will save most of the money the Wizeacres and the Must-Keep-Up-With-Joneses squander on the latter variety.

If a newborn infant or an infant a month or two months old seems content with nursing or feeding at 3-hour or even 4-hour intervals, that is the correct feeding schedule to follow—pro-

vided of course, that the baby shows a gain of 7 ounces to one-half pound a week.

For the baby's sake, Ma'am, don't mistake the machine system, the "scientific inhumanity of doctors and nurses" in the hospital, for the right care or treatment of mother or baby. As Dr. Harry Bakwin, associate professor of pediatrics at New York University College of Medicine expressed it (Time, July 9, '45): "... the scientific inhumanity of doctors and nurses. Separating the baby from its mother at birth, instead of allowing it to be cuddled and breast fed, is a bad beginning. The crime is compounded when the baby is put on a clock-ruled schedule ..."

**QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

**Terpin Hydrate**

Would it be all right to take two five-grain tablets of terpin hydrate daily for six weeks? I have obtained extraordinary relief from hacking cough by taking three grains three times a day, in capsules, but I have just found I can get it in bottles of 100 five-grain tablets (I.E.S.)

Answer—I do not advise it. I suggest only doses of two or three grains, two or three times daily, for two or three weeks, not longer. It may be taken in capsule or tablet or in a pleasant tasting liquid elixir of terpin hydrate (two grains in the teaspoonful)—but be sure NOT to take an elixir that contains a narcotic along with the terpin hydrate. The remedy gives the greatest satisfaction in chronic winter cough where there is difficult expectoration or dryness and irritation. Terpin hydrate is made from turpentine.

**Cleft Palate**

Please give your opinion as to the best time to perform the operation for the correction of cleft palate. Our baby is six weeks old and has cleft palate. (Mrs. C. F. M.)

Answer—The earlier operation for cleft palate or for harelip or both (they usually occur together) is done the better the cosmetic and functional result will be. Best time for the operation is as soon as the baby is in good nutritional condition and gaining.

**Consideration of purchase of machine that extracts the juices of vegetables, as I believe this would give my family all the vitamins they need, which cannot be gotten from the fresh vegetables and fruits otherwise. (Mrs. F. A.)**

Answer—Assure your family will get more vitamins if they eat the whole vegetable or fruit than they will if they take only the juice, no matter how it is expressed or "extracted." (Copyright 1945, John F. Dille Co.)
