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DETERIORATION BEGINS IN THE MOUTH

In a chapter on Pyorrhea in the Cyclopaedia of Medicine, Surgery and Specialties (Vol. 10, '43) Louis I. Grossman, D. D. S., D. M. D., asserts that "genuine pyorrhea without a gingival" (pocket does not exist) and in the same paragraph goes on to say that "alveolar atrophy" (wasting or shrinking of tooth sockets, bone, gum) is the first stage (of pyorrhea) "followed closely by pocket formation and suppuration."

Well, I don't know, folks, I'm just a plodding door-to-door doctor and I can't follow some of the explanations I find in our medical works. I may be showing my ignorance but it does seem to me that this presumptive authority on pyorrhea meets himself coming and going and never bats an eye by way of recognition. Now that doesn't seem very affable. When I find myself in that predicament I stop myself right there and say: "Hold on, chum, it seems one of us talks too much. Let's step aside and have a private confab about it and see if we can't find a loop-hole which will save face for us." Not Dr. Grossman—but then, I suppose an authority in such a conspicuous position can't afford to indulge in such horseplay. Dr. Grossman eastbound arbitrarily decides you can't have pyorrhea without a pocket, and then Dr. Grossman westbound breaks it gently that the first stage of pyorrhea is alveolar atrophy and after that pocket formation. To me it appears a desperate situation Dr. Grossman has gotten into. The only way out I can see is this: He can make a brave try at arguing that the first stage, alveolar atrophy, is not genuine. I have wriggled out of some embarrassing dilemmas by such methods.

Dentists sometimes diagnose "atrophic gingivitis"—a chronic recession of gum tissue—as a condition distinct from frank or
