YOU HAVEN'T ITCHED TILL YOU'VE HAD IVY POISONING

Once I was severely censured by an editor for using the term pruritus in my copy. Well I suppose the editor's annoyance was justified. Some of our medical terms are funny that way. However, the term pruritus means simply itching without a rash or other skin lesion to account for it.

Other than mention one or two simple remedies for the relief of such itching I'm afraid I can do nothing for sufferers here, but I have a pamphlet about it that gives various remedies or suggests treatment, and any reader may have a copy on written request of me provides stamped self-addressed envelope.

Of all kinds of itching I ever had—and I have had many kinds, including the seven-year, day-hour—(depending on treatment) itch, the most maddening itch—gosh all hemlock. I wonder if that wasn't what put me off my nut in the first place?—is ivy poisoning. I contracted it in the summer, the first and only attack I ever had and the itching persisted pretty constantly till the next spring. I still feel like kicking the furniture when I recall that the ivy toxin treatment (daily intramuscular injections of homeopathic doses of ivy extract) was not introduced until after my bout—or if it was in use I had not learned of it.

I believe the best treatment for ivy poisoning is a daily intramuscular injection of ivy toxin, whether the trouble is just beginning or the itching lingers on long after the skin inflammation has passed. In many cases a single "shot" seems to bring the attack to an end within a few days.

JAPANESE POWS TO HELP HARVEST

Washington, Oct. 2 — (U.P.) — Approximately 3,500 Japanese prisoners of war now are being transferred to the San Joaquin valley in California for harvest work, the war department disclosed today.

The Japanese are being taken from Camp McCoy, Wis., and Camp Clarinda Iowa, at the request of George Earl Warren and California members of congress because of the urgent need for agricultural workers.

When they no longer are needed for agricultural work in California, the Japanese prisoners will be returned to Japan.

Present schedules call for the last of the prisoners to arrive in California by Oct. 5.

Prison camp facilities will be provided by the ninth service command.

Bavarian Offices Soon Nazi Free

General Patton's Headquarters, Bavaria, Oct. 2 — (U.P.) — Dr. Wilhelm Hoegner, newly appointed minister-president of Bavaria, said today that the remaining 470,000 nazis holding civil offices in Bavaria will be purged "within months."

Fifty thousand other nazis already have been removed, Dr. Hoegner said, and most of those remaining hold minor offices.
