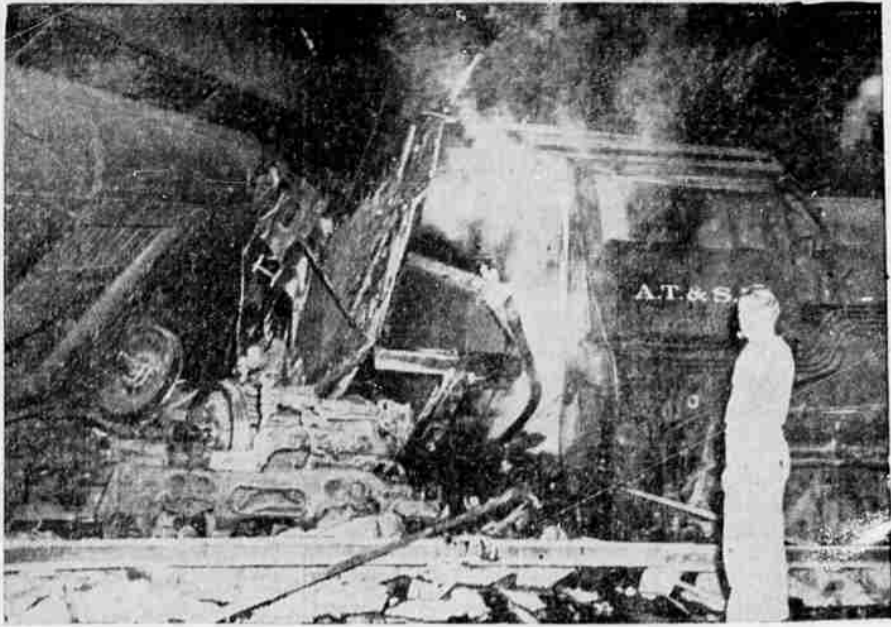

JACKSON CO. JAIL RATED SECOND IN FEDERAL SURVEY

Jackson county's jail rated second highest in the state in a survey of Oregon jails housing federal prisoners made by the federal bureau of prisons, according to a news release from Washington, D. C. The local jail ranked second only to the Portland city jail, the report states, and 32 of the state's 39 jails were ranked as unfit for federal prisoners. Portland ranked best with 57 per cent and Jackson county jail 55, and jails with ratings of under 50 per cent are "condemned" by the FBP as unfit for federal prisoners.

Federal bureau of prisons' inspectors rate jails on administration, discipline, building and equipment, personnel, food, medical service, hospital facilities, cleanliness and sanitation, personal hygiene, rehabilitation, employment and industries and religious instruction. In addition, the inspector is required to an-

swer 10 pages of form questions and make a complete personal observation report on the jail. It was stated that some of the inspections were made several years ago, but that no information had been brought to the attention of the FBP which would indicate that a reinspection would change the rating of the jail. Local officials have no record of the last inspection made of the county jail.

VETERANS, GUARD TO HAVE TWO-DAY RECRUITING DRIVE

Central Point VFW post will also be represented, according to Commander Marshal A. Day.

The drive will be conducted by a public program of music and speaking, in front of the local Chamber of Commerce Saturday evening.

FIRST WAVES, SPARS LEAVING FOR HOMES

Pearl Harbor, Oct. 10.—(U.P.)—The first contingent of Waves, Spars, and women marines to be discharged by the navy are scheduled to embark for Monterey, Cal., shortly, it was announced today.

The group will leave here Saturday, nine months after the first shipload arrived in Hawaii. A traditional Hawaiian "Alona" is planned for the 200 girls in the group.

Medford Radio Writer Commended On Script For Billie Burke Show

Commending radio writer Paul Hersey of Medford for work done for the Billie Burke show, heard Saturday mornings over the Columbia Broadcasting System, a telegram was received yesterday by the writer from Billie Burke, stage, screen and radio star of Hollywood.

Hersey, whose professional name is Paul West, his wife and two children, and Mrs. Hersey's mother, Mrs. Ethel Loudon, reside on the Phoenix-Jacksonville highway, the family having moved to Medford in March from Hollywood, where they made their home for several years.

Hersey began his career as a radio writer in 1930 and besides the Billie Burke show, has written in many other major shows on the CBS network.

The telegram from Miss Burke said the script written by West for her half-hour program "was unbelievable, such hilarious lines and situations and so beautifully constructed. Never heard so many laughs." Remarkable on a letter from West describing the valley and his home the wire said:

"Reads like some place one dreams about up there. My heartfelt gratitude. Thanks a million."

FIREWOOD OFFERS BIG PROBLEM FOR FINLAND CITIZENS

Helsinki (U.P.)—There is no lack of fuel in Finland, but the problem is how to get firewood out of the forests and into the cities.

For a period of 12 months starting June 1, Finland needs 62,000,000 cubic meters of wood, or about 9,000,000 more than during the same period last year. Of this amount 54 per cent will be reserved for use as firewood. Approximately 100,000 woodchoppers must work continuously all 12 months in order to carry out the program—but in June there were only 48,000 men in the forests.

The Finnish government has promised extra food rations and other advantages to woodchoppers, but it fears a considerable deficit in the chopping program owing to the lack of manpower and unwillingness of the workmen to do hard work in the forests.

Finland has only reserved coal supplies, which are all reserved for key industries. Last "chopping" year only 75 per cent of the wood needed was chopped, and 65 per cent transported to the cities. This year there is not much hope of better results. There is no possibility of importing coal and the nation is entirely dependent on its forests.

The port of Lake Charles, La., on the Gulf of Mexico, handled five times as much seagoing cargo during the first half of 1945 as it did in a similar period of 1944.
