BEWARE CARBOLIC ACID

The doctor gave the child the benefit of the doubt by sewing the nearly severed finger in place. Five days afterward (as the child's parent describes it) in the hospital the doctor informed the parents the child had "carbolic gangrene".

The parent is vague or careless about the identity of the doctor—no telling from the letter whether one doctor gave the child the first aid treatment and the treatment in the hospital, or perhaps a second doctor horned in and took charge in that ethical way doctors who hang around hospitals or hold "staff" positions do when such a case comes in. I know. I served as a physician on the staff of a hospital for years. It's a nice racket if you can wrangle a place on the staff. Not so nice for those who practice on their own.

THOMAS GERETY GETS AIR MEDAL WITH GOLD STAR

Aboard USS Monterey Off Tokyo—Thomas H. Gerety, 19-year-old aviation ordnance man second class and combat aircrewman, has been awarded the air medal with a gold star for duty involving fast carrier task force strikes against the Japanese homeland. The gold star represents a second air medal.

Gerety was cited for "distinguishing himself by meritorious acts while participating in aerial flights in operations against the enemy in the vicinity of Kyushu, Okinawa and Honshu."

"As gunner of a carrier-based plane during the period May 13 to Aug. 10, 1945, he participated in 10 strikes against enemy shipping, airfields and installations, inflicting extensive damage," the citation reads.

Gerety has been recommended for an additional award in connection with a daring and successful attack on a heavy cruiser, caught cowering at anchor in the Inland Sea off Kure on July 28.

Gerety's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas H. Gerety, live at 120 South Newtown street in Medford. He was attending Medford high school when he joined the navy on May 23, 1943.
