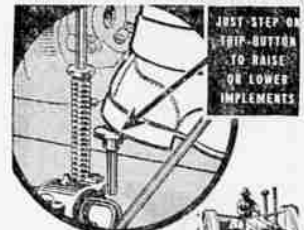

50,000 YOUTHS TO BE DRAFTED DURING OCTOBER

Washington, Oct. 20—(U.P.)—You too can still be a soldier, and if you are a healthy male between 18 and 26 you can almost count on it.

Selective Service does know the war is over, all right, but says the duration isn't. So draft boards will induct 50,000 men this month and many more each month until congress or the army and navy decree otherwise.

Youngsters turning 18 will take care of half this quota. The rest will come from men not yet 26 who previously have been deferred.

If you're under 26 and have children, your draft board will give you "preference." That means you get the call anyway if there are not plenty of non-fathers to fill it.

Some Deferments
Deferments are possible for men whose work is in support of the national health, safety and interest. This means whatever your draft board says it means, ordinarily. WMC's list of essential jobs has been junked.

As guides, national headquarters suggests consideration for workers in transportation, farming, food processing, certain other fields. High school students can now graduate, provided they wind it up before age 20.

College is no bar to the draft. You can finish a semester, though, and students in medicine, dentistry, divinity can stay at their studies right on. Selective Service is prepared to keep the work as long as congress sees fit.

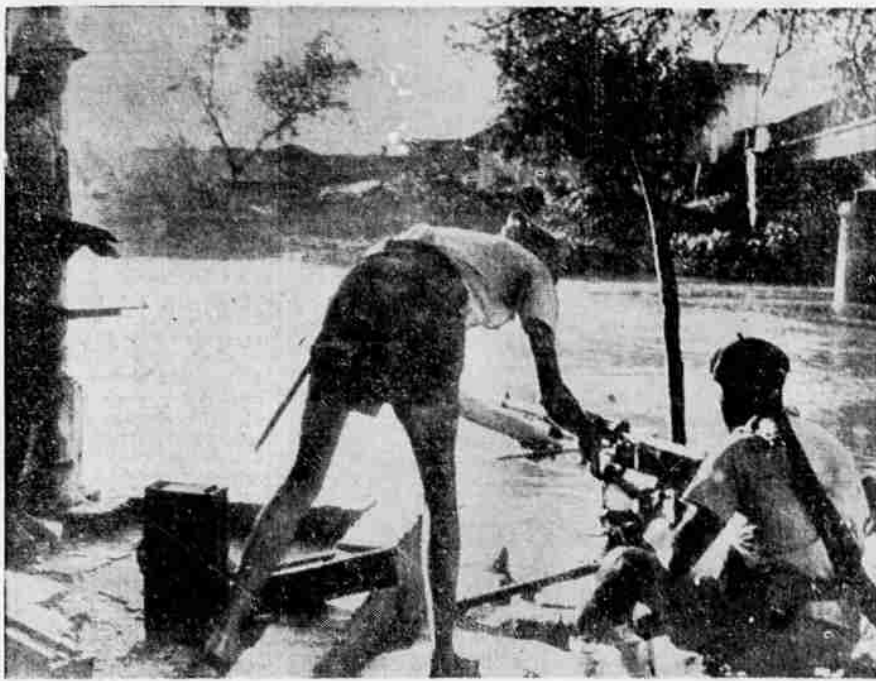
Annual Auction Of Lions on Wednesday

NO PEACE SIGNS LUMBER STRIKE

Portland, Ore., Oct. 20—(U.P.)—The five-state AFL lumber strike today had at its beginning four weeks ago.

After a week of banning pickets, fighting bans, attending hearings and conducting negotiations, neither side showed signs of giving in.

An important step toward the right direction is a meeting in Eugene Monday of lumber operators and union men, predicted by observers to have an important effect on the future. The Willamette Valley Operators Association and the Willamette valley district council, Lumber and Sawmill Workers, AFL, will discuss the industry-wide \$1.10 minimum wage demand.

BAY AREA STRIKE THREATS VOICED

Oakland, Cal., Oct. 20—(U.P.)—CIO Spokesmen James P. Smith, speaking for both CIO and AFL union machinists, tonight warned that unless employers agreed to a five-point union wage-holiday program a San Francisco bay area strike will be called Oct. 29.

San Francisco, Oct. 20—(U.P.)—Striking bus drivers and Pacific Greyhound officials tonight accused each other of breaking "no public statement" pledges as the walkout of 2,700 workers continued to tie up bus travel in seven western states for the 17th day.

San Francisco, Oct. 20—(U.P.)—An immediate wage increase of 25 cents an hour in basic pay was demanded today for the west coast longshoremen by the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union (CIO).

Major General Dies In Transport Crash

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 20—(U.P.)—Air force officers tonight were investigating the crash of a transport plane that killed Brig-Gen Stuart C. Godfrey, 59, commanding general of Geiger Field here, and four other persons.

The plane, a C-54 crashed last night six miles east of here and within 15 miles of its home field. It rammed into a hillside, plowing through a grove and setting a forest fire in a gulch. The transport was returning from Hamilton Field, Calif.

JUNIOR RED CROSS WORKERS NEEDED

Junior Red Cross headquarters issued a call today for more members to work in the Junior Red Cross workshop, located in the Holly Theater building on West Sixth street.

The program as outlined by Miss Vera Humphrey is a varied one and needs the skill of many workers if the deadlines of the army and navy are to be met.

Hallowe'en favorites and decorations must be finished for the Navy hospital; Christmas boxes must be completed for shipment by Oct. 31. These boxes include game boards, Christmas cards, toys and gifts for children of the liberated countries.

"Menus for navy ships must be completed by the end of the month. This is your shop junior workers. Your efforts are desperately needed now," Miss Humphrey said.

The Junior Red Cross workshop is open daily between 10 a. m. and 6 p. m., including Saturday. Adult craftsmen who can give time to do the more difficult tasks and relieve Miss Humphrey for other important duties are urged to participate.

Manufacturers Of DDT Insecticides Face Crack-Down

Washington, Sept. 25—(U.P.)—The government is preparing to crack down on manufacturers who are cashing in on the magic name of DDT with so-called "DDT insecticides" that are really of little or no value as bug-killers.

Government scientists emphasized that DDT actually is as potent as its reputation indicates. But the trouble with many "DDT" products now on the market, they said, is that they have as little as 1/100 of one per cent DDT.

Most effective solutions, the Agriculture department said, contain at least five per cent.
