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## STRYCHNINE POISONING, LOCKJAW AND 'HYDROPHOBIA'

A characteristic sign of strychnine poisoning is the occurrence of spasms or convulsions, and in some instances strychnine poisoning is mistaken for "lockjaw" (tetanus) because spasms or convulsions characterize tetanus too. In one instance a little tot playing about the house came upon a package of red sugar coated tablets of strychnine and ate some as "candy." Presently the child went into convulsions, unfortunately, at the time, there was a tremendous "mad dog" campaign on and the pragmatic health department seized upon the opportunity to stampeze the credulous public—the health department doctors (usually doctors who, for want of a practice of their own, are glad to take a job that assures them the means of living), anxious to please the politician in control, "pronounced" the case "hydrophobia"—not just rabies. If you will notice, but "hydrophobia" which the politicians prefer as being, in their shrewd estimation, the more frightful term—started Pasteur treatment immediately, but pointed out with regret that it was "too late," for the child succumbed within 24 hours.

It was odd, that case of health department "hydrophobia." According to the child's parent the child had been apparently perfectly well up to the abrupt occurrence of the first convulsion. The parent knew of no animal, scratch or bite by dog or animal, although a puppy in the neighborhood often played with the children. There was nothing wrong with the puppy and the parent knew of no dog or other animal in the neighborhood that was vicious or behaving strangely. The parent admitted that there was a box of red sugar coated tablets in a cupboard, left there for a year or two, and the children could have found them.

**ATOM MAY GIVE BIG POWER SOURCE**  
Dayton, O., Oct. 26—(U.P.)—First use of atomic energy for peacetime purposes will be in large power plant installations. In the opinion of one of the key figures in the development of the atomic bomb, Dr. Charles A. Thomas, research vice-president of the Monsanto Chemical Co., who expressed that view, said that a lot of the "Buck Rogers" applications of atomic power that people are talking about—such as in planes and automobiles—are still "a long way off."

However, he added, "for large power plant installations, I don't think it's far off."  
Thomas, who was in charge of the chemistry and purification processes in producing plutonium for the atomic bomb, flew here from his home in St. Louis to meet with a group of 16 newsmen making a reconversion study of the nation's industry. The tour was arranged by the National Association of Manufacturers.
