Returning servicemen, football, weddings and engagements, and the approach of Hallowe'en and Armistice Day have been the topics of the week. The younger set already have planned their Hallowe'en fun and frolics while the older folk are looking forward to a holiday Nov. 12, this being set as the day of the traditional Armistice Day celebration since Nov. 11 falls on Sunday this year.

Every train, plane and bus has its quota of young men and women returning from war duties. Among those recently arrived were Gordon Rector, who has been discharged after serving three and one-half years

with the signal corps, including 33 months in the European theater, and Com. George H. Winne, who is home for a visit after duty in the Pacific. Com. Winne has been in the regular navy for 10 years.

With every port filled with ships for Navy Day, a number of navy men have been permitted to visit their homes. Here are Lt. Oliver P. (Jim) Taylor of the USS Independence, James T. Bush, chief gunner's mate of the USS Topeka, and Lt. Eston Way of the battleship Wisconsin. Harold Sutherland, petty officer in the Seabees, is home after 15 months in England.

Others home after being released from service are T/Sgt. Herbert Guenther, who was stationed 31 months in a ferrying base in Florida; Albert Thompson, who served 38 months with the third fleet in the Pacific; former S/Sgt. Clarence A. Neat-hamer, in the air corps three and one-half years; Bruce Norris, in the Pacific with the navy for 27 months; Chester E. Carter, who served 42 months and participated in the European campaign; R. A. Morgan, former sergeant with the fifth air force and overseas 30 months and William Spencer, in the army air corps for more than five years.

Capt. Lewis Hedgepeth, home after two years overseas duty, has been visiting his parents at Central Point and former Sgt. A. J. Joyner, recently discharged, has gone to Seattle to reside. Fred A. Culver, technician fifth grade, writes that he will be home soon from the Pacific

where he has been for the past 18 months. Albert Busby has been released as a first sergeant in the medical corps.

Pfc. Stanley Kunzman, now in Czechoslovakia, is writing sports for the "Attack" newspaper of the 94th Division and Pfc. Arthur L. Satterlee, now stationed in Germany, recently wrote to say that he had been to London to visit his great-uncle. Satterlee participated in the Sicilian and Italian campaigns.

T/Sgt. Houston Pitts' last letter home told of his experiences during the recent typhoons on Okinawa. The sergeant, who has been in India, said he didn't know whether he was headed for home or for Roper Card, CM 3/c in the Seabees, who arrived just in time to experience the typhoon.

Comments on the Philippine Islands have come from Pvt. Sharon Wight, who recently arrived there, the sergeant writing that his outfit was the first to arrive minus guns. From the 98th division comes word that Cpl. John C. Snook was being awarded a citation for meritorious achievement in connection with operations on Leyte and Okinawa. On Leyte the corporal served as a cargo truck driver and on Okinawa he was first battalion transportation corporal. The distinguished flying cross, awarded posthumously to T/Sgt. Harold M. Thompson, was recently presented to his parents by an officer from the Medford air base.

Medford high's football team ran their season score up to 249, compared to their opponents' seven, when they scored almost at will to chalk up a 51 to 0 victory over Klamath Falls at Modoc Field last Friday night. Medford made 23 first downs to Klamath's three and accumulated a total of 564 net yards to the Pelican's mere 53.
