

GI FARM LOANS FSA MEET TOPIC

The government agricultural farm loan program for farmers and war veterans was main topic of discussion at the district FSA meeting in Eugene last week, according to Earl Ulrich and Edward Chamberlain, FSA county committeemen.

A national survey shows over a million service men wish to return to farms, and a majority

want to operate a farm of their own, the committeemen were told.

The county FSA committee is authorized to determine eligibility of applicants for loans to purchase farms or personal property, to assist in determining a reasonable family type size farm unit, and to certify as to its economic normal earning capacity, in conjunction with a loan.

Eligible veterans may obtain loans up to \$1,200 at three per cent interest to buy a farm, and up to \$2,500 at five per cent to finance livestock and equipment. The civilian farm loan program will continue about the same as in the past.

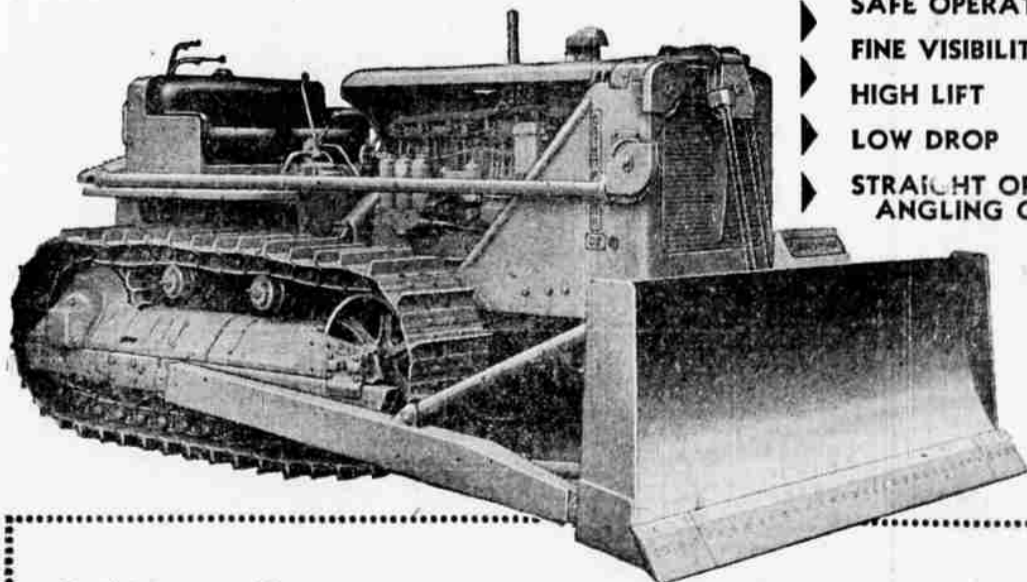
