# TORNADO LEAVES FOR NORTH BEND DISTRICT CLASH

Medford's Black Tornado eleven left this morning for North Bend where they will open defense of their state championship tomorrow at 2 p. m. against the undefeated North Bend Bulldogs in the first of three titular playoffs.

They are scheduled to go through a light workout on the North Bend field this afternoon in their final tapering-off effort before facing the Bulldogs for the District 2 title.

**Riggs Ready**  
 Coach Simpson said yesterday that Darrell Riggs, Medford's all-state end who has been out of action since the Grants Pass game, will be ready to go tomorrow. He has been in uniform all week, but has been taking it lightly in practice sessions.

However, Bob Watson, Simpson's bruising fullback, may not get into tomorrow's fracas because of a broken blood vessel sustained during the week. A physician's report is expected to clear up Battering Bobby's physical status today, and to determine whether he'll see action and how much of it. If the report is negative, Lloyd Carr will move into the fullback slot.

**Hostwick Out**  
 Simpson also said that Glenn Hostwick, the other half of the Tornado touchdown twins, is definitely out of the North Bend scrap and probably through for the season. Hostwick suffered a painful shoulder separation on the second play of the Ashland game, and it has failed to respond satisfactorily to treatment.

His left halfback spot will be filled by Bill Singler, 160-pound junior, who played a bang-up game after relieving Hostwick.

# 1945 NL AWARD TO PHIL CAVARETTA

New York, Nov. 15—(U.P.)—Phil Cavaretta of the champion Chicago Cubs never progressed in baseball geographically speaking, but he made up today for being a "stay-at-home" by winning the most valuable player award in the National league for 1945.

Cavaretta, the still-youthful first baseman of the pennant-winning Bruins was the choice of a committee of the baseball writers of America, and he piled up a decisive total of 15 first place votes, seven seconds and one fifth, failing to score on only one ballot.

The grinning Italian who became a prep school star with Lane Technical high school on Chicago's North Side and moved into a regular job as Cub first baseman in 1935 when he was 17 years old, hit his peak last summer after a "decade of progress."

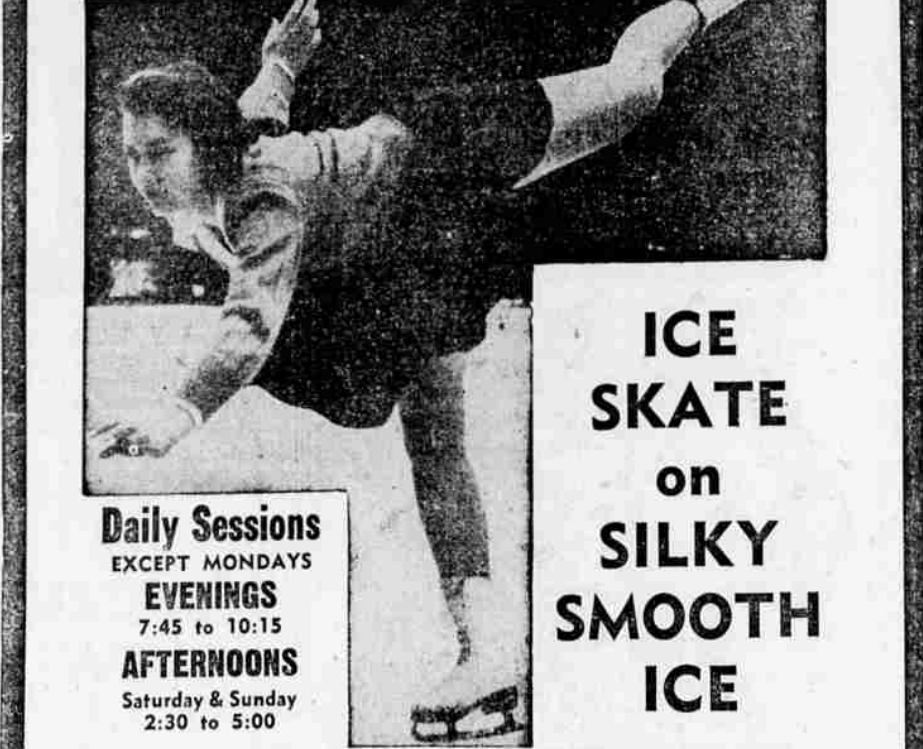
