Nuernberg, Nov. 16—(U.P.)—The four-power war crimes tribunal today postponed prosecution of charges against the aged and ailing Gustav Krupp, but deferred a decision as to whether his son, Alfred, would be tried instead.

The probability of a delay in the Nuernberg trials, possibly until Jan. 2, was strengthened by the decision not to try Gustav Krupp now.
