Mrs. Mary Helms has returned to her home, 1009 East Main street, after spending two weeks visiting her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs.

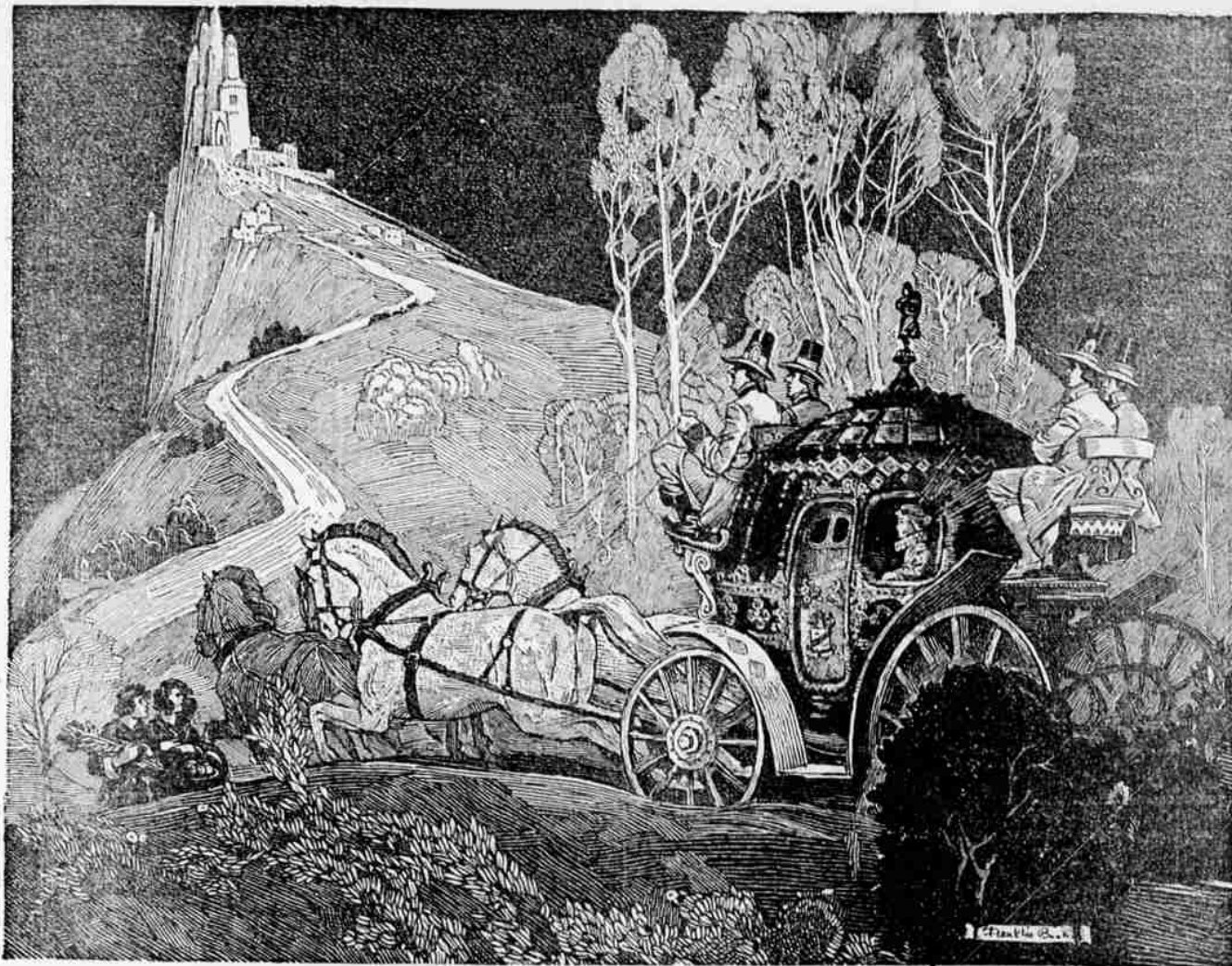
