

Newsprint Pinch Will Grow Worse During Next Six Months, Is Outlook

San Francisco, Nov. 27.—(U.P.) Pacific coast newspaper publishers and thousands of dependent readers today face a continuing newsprint shortage for at least the next six months despite war's end and the lifting of strict wartime controls.

Major newsprint headquarters agree that the end of the war has brought no improvement to the present shortage, under which publishers operated during the war.

One of the largest producers hinted the scarcity of newsprint will become even more critical under peacetime operations.

But the paper manufacturers themselves disagree as to the causes of the continuing shortage and to the exact extent of further cuts in shipments to newspapers.

The one idea the paper-making companies all agree on is that little—if anything—can be done immediately to put more and thicker newspapers in readers' hands.

A new complication arose last week when James B. Long, general manager of the California Newspaper Publishers' association, announced that Crown Zellerbach, a major western newsprint producer, notified publishers of a 20 per cent cut in deliveries because of logging crew shortages.

Long said many California newspapers, with only a few days newsprint on hand, faced shutting down unless already-disrupted deliveries were maintained.

A spokesman for Crown Zellerbach, however, declined to verify Long's announcement. "Shortage of logs and labor" was blamed by the company for the present decrease in newsprint supplies. Present strike of

60,000 AFL lumber workers in the Pacific northwest, the spokesman said, had not "seriously interfered" with paper-making operations.
