

CALIFORNIA ENDS WITH 6 TO 0 WIN

Berkeley, Calif., Dec. 1—(U.P.) Coach Buck Shaw's University of California football team ended a dull season on a high note today with their second consecutive upset victory by downing favored St. Mary's pre-flight 6-0 before 30,000 fans.

One quick thrust, aided by penalties, gave the Bears the victory in the first period. After that it was a mid-field struggle with Coach Bernie Masterson's navy team trying everything in the book—including a spread formation stretching across the entire field—to get back into the game.

ARMY WINS 32-13 OVER NAVY; LUCK AGAINST MIDDIES

Blanchard Star of Game Before 102,000 — Penalties Costly

Philadelphia, Pa., Dec. 1—(U.P.) Army's fabulous football team marched into the halls of gridiron greatness today when it finished its second consecutive all-victorious season by defeating Navy, 32 to 13, before a crowd of 102,000, including President and Mrs. Truman.

It took Blanchard, the greatest fullback to roam the country's gridirons since Bronko Nagurski's days at Minnesota in the 20's, and the Minnesotan in the game to make this climactic classic a triumph for the West Pointers. Except for those first 15 minutes, Navy was always in the ball game, but when the Middies most needed luck it turned against them.

Navy finally had to give away before the power which Blanchard and his all-American running mate, Glenn Davis, generated behind a hard charging Army line, but the Midshipmen made a fight of it after that.

The game was only three minutes and 38 seconds old when Blanchard plowed over for the first score. He was to go over twice more with his touchdown twin, Davis, accounting for the other Army tallies.

Navy's Jim Carrington kicked off short to Tucker, who took the ball on his 25 and ran it back to his 44. Then he carried the ball himself on the first play and went to Navy's 44. Davis took a lateral from Tucker to make it first down on Navy's 24.

The first break of the game came at that point. Blanchard on his first shot at Navy's sturdy line was downed after only a two yard gain, but Navy was offside and penalized five yards. Those five yards proved important for it took Blanchard three more tries before Army got another first down on Navy's 13.

Then the Middies erred again. Blanchard was stopped after going two yards but again the Middies were offside and Army had the ball on Navy's eight. Tucker swept right ending to the three and then after picking up two yards in his first try, Doc went over for the first touchdown.

Eight minutes later it was Blanchard who put a clink in the Middies armor again. Bob Kelly former Notre Dame star, got off a weak punt that carried only to the Navy 38. Another of those costly penalties set Navy back Tucker, on a quarterback sneak, went to the 17. Then the ball went to Blanchard and it was another Army touchdown.

Army took a Navy punt on the Navy 49 and on the first play Davis went through right tackle for another touchdown.

The game stayed that way until, with only five seconds left to go in the first half, Navy struck for a score.

Taking the Army's kickoff at the start of the second half, the Middies started out like they were going places. They took the ball on their 15 and drove to the 42. Then a Smith pass went wide of its mark and Blanchard intercepted it on the Navy 45

and ran for his third touchdown. Davis trapped deep trying to pass, threw one which Smith intercepted on the Army 33 and carried to the 26. Barrow hit tackle to the 15, Bartos went through center to the three and in two tries carried it over.

The game was in the fourth quarter by that time and to make sure that everything was all over Davis went to the pay-off ground from the Navy 28.
