THE COMMON COLD
Just what "the common cold" is, has been a puzzle to many medical scientists. Writers in prominent medical journals admit they do not know what a common cold is or its cause. Medical scientists have spent time and money in search for a definite causative germ. Thus far their search has been futile. And yet much treatment has been given on this basis, as yet unproved. Red Tokens Must Be Deposited In Ration Accounts

All red tokens in possession of retailers, wholesalers and primary distributors of rationed meats and fats must be turned in to ration bank accounts by Dec. 11, G. M. Hafenbrack, OPA ration banking executive, has announced. The meats-fats ration stamps, however, need not be in, but may be disposed of, he said. Points due on past transactions need not be collected, he said. Consumers are not being asked to turn in their red tokens, but are reminded not to dispose of war ration book four, as it will be needed for sugar.
