

1320 X-RAYED IN FOUR-DAY STAY OF MOBILE UNIT

There were 1320 people given chest X-rays in the four days that the Oregon Tuberculosis association's mobile unit was located in Medford, Mrs. Dwight Findley, county chairman of the drive, reported last night. The X-ray technicians completed their Medford schedule Tuesday and prepared to move into Ashland, where the mobile unit will be located at the fire hall for two days. Mrs. Findley described the campaign, to date, as a great success, in voicing her appreciation of the fine cooperation extended the Jackson County Public Health association by hosts of individuals, businesses and organizations.

Assisting the technicians Tuesday were the following volunteers: Mrs. C. A. Sander, Mrs. Richard Phair, Mrs. Allen Perry, Mrs. James Keeble, Mrs. Kenneth Dentman, Mrs. Robert C. Hart and Mrs. Findley.

The X-rays, developed on the mobile unit, are sent into Portland, where they are read by a staff of doctors. The report of the doctors is mailed directly back to the individual X-rayed if there are no complications revealed in the picture. If the miniature X-ray indicates chest trouble of any type needing attention the doctors request a larger X-ray and this request is made to Dr. A. E. Merkel, Jackson county public health officer. He, in turn, contacts the individual, who is asked to appear for a larger X-ray. This X-ray is also financed by the Jackson County Public Health association at no cost to the individual. The findings are reported to the person X-rayed, who is advised to contact his personal physician.

This program is financed by Christmas seal sale funds as part of the widespread campaign to eradicate tuberculosis.

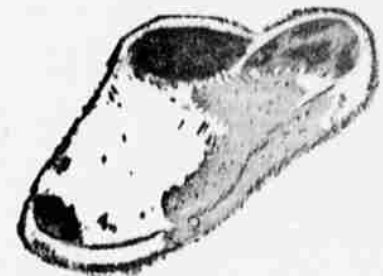
