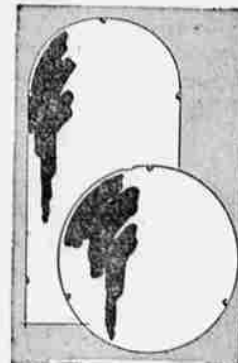
THREE DIE IN FIRE

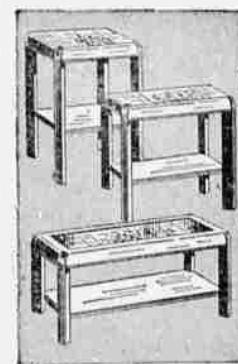

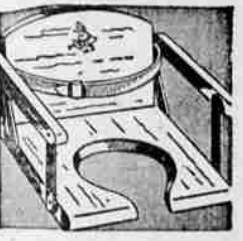

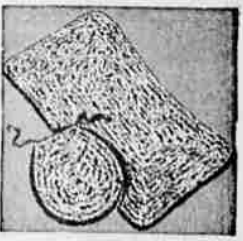
