

TEN PLANES TO BASE HERE FOR SEARCH, RESCUE

Ten officers and about 34 enlisted men, manning ten planes, will make up Sector Center No. 7 of the search and rescue unit of the Army air corps now being established at the Medford air base, Major Frank Rasor of the unit announced today. It is expected that the unit will be completely ready for operation by the end of the week the major said.

Five of the planes will be of the liaison aircraft type and five will be twin-engine planes, Rasor declared. While primarily intended for the rescue of service personnel, the unit will also be available for transport aid and other rescue work, the officer said. The unit will be organized to take care of ground rescue operations, will be affiliated with the ski patrol and will work in close contact with forest rangers, state patrolmen and local authorities, according to Major Rasor.

Civilians seeing a plane crash, hearing any unusual noise which might be that of a crashing plane, noticing unusual fires which might result from a crashed plane are asked to call the Medford air base, collect if necessary, phone 5281, extension six, and convey the information to Major Rasor, he said. The officer said that radio stations and newspapers were cooperating in the matter of disseminating information concerning the search and rescue.

Portland, Ore., Dec. 12—An emergency caesarian operation performed at a Portland hospital just a few minutes after the mother had died saved the life of her son, hospital officials revealed today.

The mother died of pneumonia Sunday night and the resident physician at St. Vincent's hospital, Dr. Jerry Nelson, operated immediately. Hospital officials said it was one of few successful such operations. Although premature, the child was reported normal and thriving in an incubator. He weighed four pounds, two ounces.

Army Returning Bodies of Two Mexican Pilots

Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 12—(U.P.) In a precedent-shattering move, the army is shipping home the bodies of two pilots of Mexico's famed Fighter Squadron 201, military officials disclosed today.

The admission came grudgingly. First questions concerning the bodies brought the off-hand reply the men were "just a couple Mexicans."

Semi-official military sources explained the secrecy surrounding the return of the bodies as "a matter of policy."

"There has been considerable agitation to have our American dead returned home for burial," they said. "This incident would be ammunition for exponents of such a move."
