

EX-FELON ADMITS MYSTERY MURDER OF BOBBY SOXER

San Francisco, Dec. 15.—(AP) Thomas Henry McMonigle, 35-year-old ex-convict has confessed the kidnap-murder of Santa Clara County, Calif., 14-year-old Bobby Soxer, the Federal Bureau of Investigation announced today.

McMonigle, an ex-convict and one-time bus driver in San Mateo, Cal., admitted shooting the attractive brunette to death on a lonely road and dumping her body over a 350-foot cliff in the Pacific ocean.

The disclosure came six weeks and one day after Thora, daughter of a San Jose contractor, vanished after getting into the battered sedan of the man whom Thora's schoolmates said had tried to lure other girls with offers of a "job taking care of children."

The girl's body has not yet been recovered, and E. J. Connelley, assistant director of the FBI in charge of the Chamberlain and Dickie Tum Suden cases in San Francisco, said the search in the immediate area beneath the cliff has been abandoned because of "impossible conditions."

McMonigle will be turned over

today to Sheriff William J. Emig of Santa Clara county. The FBI said that McMonigle admitted luring Thora into his car by asking her the direction to near-by Santa Cruz. He said he became lost because of unfamiliarity with the roads but finally reached Santa Cruz and then turned off on California state highway No. 1 and approximately three-tenths of a mile south of the Santa Cruz-San Mateo county line he shot the girl to death with an automatic pistol.
