ATLANTIC STORM DAMAGES 2 SHIPS

London, Dec. 18.—(U.P.)—The U. S. heavy cruiser Augusta, loaded with homeward-bound American troops, flashed word that she had been damaged by heavy seas in a north Atlantic gale today and was turning back for emergency repairs in a British port.

Simultaneously, British naval monitors intercepted a call from the American aircraft carrier Wasp reporting that it also was in trouble after a 48-hour battering in the Atlantic.

The Wasp was en route to Britain to pick up returning American troops when it plowed head-on into the storm Sunday.

There was no immediate word on the extent of the damage to either ship, but terse radio messages said they expected to make port some time tomorrow.

VETERAN AVENGES WIFE'S DEFECTION

Los Angeles, Dec. 18.—(U.P.)—A jealous army veteran, his estranged wife and the man he suspected of stealing her love were dead today in a triangle shooting blamed on the husband's professed inability to please the pretty wife he called "man crazy."

Police said that Julius F. Sokol, 29, crashed through a living-room window at the home of his wife's parents last night, shot to death Mrs. Georgianna Sokol, 27, and Joseph Oliver, 30, then fatally wounded himself.

Sokol, discharged from the air corps Nov. 16, had brooded over his wife's divorce suit, investigators said.
