

OPA OFFICE HERE TO HANDLE WORK FOR 2 COUNTIES

All OPA transactions for Jackson and Josephine counties will be handled at the Medford war price and ration board office in the city hall after Jan. 1. The Ashland board was closed some time ago and with the ends of the rationing Jan. 1, the Grant Pass office will also be closed it is said. Only sugar rationing, rent control and price control remain for OPA to administer.

In the absence of Leonard Carpenter, chairman of the volunteer board, who has left to spend several weeks in Arizona, Clatus McCredie, chief of police for Medford, will act as assistant chairman and carry on any necessary duties.

Mr. Carpenter stated before leaving that the board had not been given any information as to the future intentions of OPA concerning sugar rationing. Staff of the local board will be one rent clerk and four price clerks, Carpenter stated.
