**TROOP CARRIERS JOIN  
ANCHORED HOTEL SHIPS**  
San Francisco, Dec. 29 (U.P.) The USS Mendocino arrived here late yesterday from Yokohama with 1,778 army personnel, including Brig. Gen. Julian W. Cunningham, Fort Worth, Tex.

The Cap Newenham came in with 1,921 soldiers from Manila. Both vessels joined the lineup

of "hotel ships," riding at anchor in the harbor until dock space was available. Three hotel ships debarked today when the troops were moved to Camp Stoneman for outfitting and transportation to their home areas. About 29,000 California women enlisted in the armed services during World War II.
