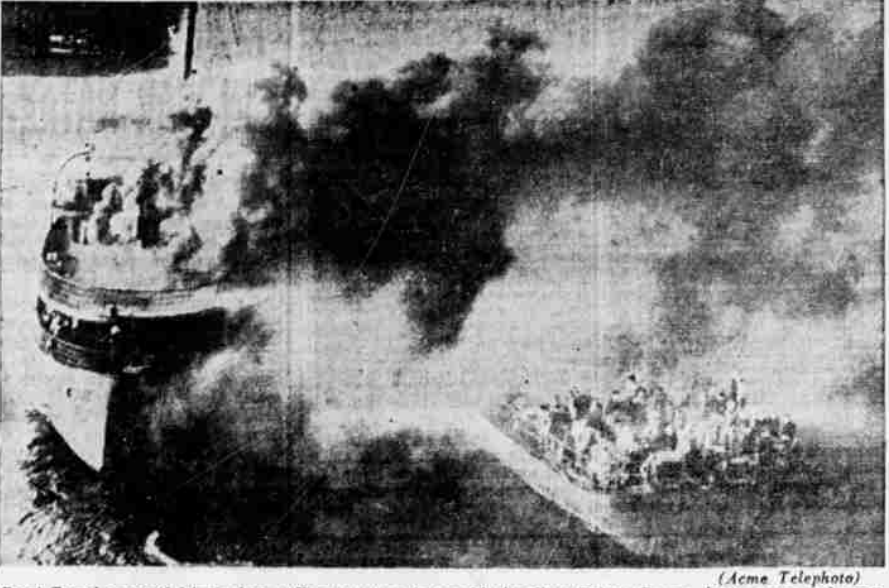

MORSE CHARGES COURT MARTIAL SIDETRACK AIM

Washington, Jan. 2 — (UP) — Sen. Wayne Morse, R., Ore., charged today that the army and navy are trying to sidetrack his resolution for a congressional investigation of court martial sentences in the service.

Morse said that more than two weeks ago he had asked of the senate the severest court martial sentences handed down by each army and navy for a list of 50 of the hundred court martial sentences handed down by each, but had received no reply. He said lack of action on his resolution for a general inquiry indicated senate demerits were trying to block the move.

Under the Morse resolution the investigation would be conducted by a special committee composed of three members of the military affairs committee, three from the naval affairs committee and three from the judiciary committee.

Don't Want It "But the army and navy don't want an investigation because they know it would show shocking injustices," Morse said. "It would disclose the tyrannical nature of the courts and the arbitrary procedures followed by them. Sen. William F. Knowland, R., Calif., and I have just checked up and found that the courts martial still are passing out wartime penalties for acts committed in peacetime.

"Boys are receiving sentences of many years for acts which would be considered only misdemeanors in civilian courts."

Iron Lung Plan Of Airplane Factory Huntington Beach, Cal. — (UP) A new industry is developing in a former feeder plant of the Consolidated-Vultee Aircraft Co. here. A plastic "iron lung" feather light in comparison to previous ponderous steel machines, is being manufactured.

The plastic iron lung performs all the functions of the heavier models in aiding the breathing of paralytics and aiding blood circulation in heart cases, according to President Gordon F. Samuels.

TRAFFIC DEATHS WILL TAKE JUMP IN COMING YEAR

Greatest Increase in Nation's History Seen Unless Safety Effort Is Made.

Washington, Jan. 2 — (UP) — The New Year will bring the greatest increase in traffic deaths in history unless a thorough nationwide safety effort is made, the American Automobile Association warned today.

"Every visible factor is combining to bring about an unprecedented rate of increase in street and highway deaths," H. J. Brunner, president of the AAA, said in his forecast for 1946.

Mileage Grows "With the removal of gasoline and tire rationing restrictions, motor vehicle mileage has increased by leaps and bounds, with resultant increased accident exposure," he added.

Brunner said there were three main factors contributing to the rising death toll: 1. Many cars are far past normal service life and badly in need of repairs. 2. Millions of people have done little driving during war years and must learn to drive again. 3. Pedestrians are accustomed to crossing streets on which there was very little traffic.

Cautious Lacking "And a less obvious, but no less important factor," he continued, "is the over-all postwar psychology—a tendency to react too strongly to the removal of abnormal strains, restrictions or dangers by casting all caution aside."

Brunner said that the dimming prospect of all-out motor car production and scarcity of tires means that car and tire conservation must be continued, both to keep the passenger car fleet intact and to prevent an "even worse increase" in the accident totals.

He said President Truman's call for a nationwide traffic safety conference "a much-needed step in a time of real peril," and urged its support by all organizations and individuals working for public safety."
