**New Drag-Line To Start Operation Soon at J'Ville**

Jacksonville, Jan. 4—Arrival of a drag-line, now enroute and expected within two days, will enable the new J. C. McKim placer mining plant here to initiate operation.

McKim says that the plant should open about Monday. Four or five men will be employed by the unit which is mobile in nature.

The plant, located on F street between the Stage road and 3rd street, will work over that area.

McKim is concentrating on the construction of an additional unit. Together the two will employ eight to 10 men.
