

## QUEEN CANDIDATES SELECTED FOR C. P. VETERANS' JUBILEE

Central Point, Jan. 11—Candidates for queen of the American Legion sponsored World War II veterans' homecoming jubilee here January 19 have been named, William B. Keizer Sr., chairman of committees for the event, said yesterday.

Candidates and sponsors are: Gwen Goin, junior auxiliary; Barbara Hawley, VFW; Anne Bohner, Grange; Jean Kincaid, Sportsmen's club; and Jeanette Brown, sponsor unnamed. The one elected will be presented a \$25 victory bond.

Keizer states that there will be special entertainment in addition to the coronation ceremonies and dance program. A 1946 radio and a floor lamp will be given away.

Further progress on the Legion hall was made Sunday when George Beltz, Charles Lewis and Al Weldon, plumbers from AFL local 418, contributed eight hours labor each. Part of the windows have arrived and have been installed, Keizer says. Soon as the windows are in the building can be used for meetings. Members of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters from Medford have contributed \$50 toward completion of the hall.

## CITY COURT FINES \$4,182 LAST YEAR

A report made Wednesday by City Police Judge J. R. Woodford on activities of the city police court for last year revealed that \$4,182.50 was taken by the court in fines and forfeited bail.

In 494 arrests for drunkenness, a total of \$2,404 in fines and bail was taken. Remainder of the 957 arrests included 229 overparking offenses, and other miscellaneous traffic violations and misconduct charges.

Although comparative figures for 1945 were not available, Judge Woodford stated that the city's income last year from the court was considerably more than the year before.
