School Entrance Rules Announced

Children entering school for the first time January 28, opening date of the new school semester, must be six years old by March 25 in order to begin classes without taking the preliminary examination, according to an announcement from the

city school superintendent's office. Those children who will be six after March 25, but before the end of the school term, can enter beginning with the new semester by passing the examination.

For appointments to take the exam parents should call Mrs. George B. Canode, first grade instructor at Washington school, telephone 4916. Mrs. Canode gives the tests to eligible children.

ESCAPEE'S SISTER TO BE RETURNED HERE FOR TRIAL

Doris Burtis, sister of Calvin L. Burtis who escaped from the Jackson county jail with three other inmates Jan. 5, has waived extradition and will be returned here from Susanville, Calif., some time next week. Sheriff Howard Gault said he was told by Olin S. Johnson, sheriff of Lassen county, Calif.

Miss Burtis is wanted by Jackson county officials for allegedly smuggling hacksaw blades into the jail enabling her brother, Bobby J. Nelson, Roger Chapman and Edward Mackay to escape. Chapman and Mackay, Negroes, were captured soon after the break for freedom and Burtis and his sister were seized at Susanville after an armed robbery in which they supposedly took part. Nelson, thought to be implicated in the robbery, has not been apprehended.

A car belonging to Harold Sutton, 203 North Peach street, Medford, which was stolen by the jail breakers, was found in Burtis' possession at the time of his arrest.

Burtis, Gault said he learned, is being held by the Lassen County sheriff's office on the armed robbery charge and will receive from five years to life in the penitentiary if convicted. His sister will be prosecuted for aiding and abetting a jail escape.

MOTEL AND SHOP WILL BE BUILT NEAR GOLD HILL

Gold Hill, Jan. 19—Construction of a motel and a machine shop on adjoining properties along the Pacific highway just north of here will start Monday. E. L. Browning is erecting six frame overnight motel units and A. L. and B. L. Norris, brothers, will build the 50 by 25 foot shop.

Browning's motel units will be 12 by 18 feet and will have adjoining garages. He hopes to complete them in about two months and then begin construction of eight housekeeping units which will have two rooms and bath and will measure 16 by 20 feet. Browning, who came here last September from Oakland, Calif., where he had two variety stores, thinks his project will require six months to complete.

Eventual plan of Browning is establishment of an amusement park somewhere between Medford and Grants Pass. A swimming pool and roller rink would be the main attractions.

The Norris brothers expect to complete their shop in about one month. They will do general repairing and welding and hope to get work on heavy duty equipment. Their shop will have a 14 by 14 foot service station porch. The men have previously done logging work.

Leveling of the ground for the two projects was recently completed.

PUBLIC ASSURED ESPEE PULLMANS SOUTH BY FEB. 15

ODT order effective February 15 will release short line cars where the run is greater than 351 miles. On March 1 the order will release short line cars where the run is 251 miles or more. On March 15th it will release all short line cars.

Under this order the Southern Pacific will establish over night sleeping car service between southern Oregon and San Francisco where the distance is 442 miles effective February 15. Effective March 1 Southern Pacific will restore sleeping car service between Portland and southern Oregon points. The distance Portland to Ashland is 342 miles. Effective March 15 the Southern Pacific will restore the overnight sleeping car service between Portland and Coos Bay where the distance is 245 miles.

Under the same order, effective on February 15 the overnight sleeping car service between Sacramento and Los Angeles, between Los Angeles and Phoenix where the distances are in excess of 351 miles will be restored. On March 1 the overnight service between San Rafael and Eureka, Calif., will be

restored, where that distance is in excess of 250 miles. On March 15 the overnight service between San Francisco and Reno, between San Francisco and Fresno and between other points where service was discontinued in July will be restored.
