Oregon Teacher Appears In Outstanding Concert

An evening of rare musical satisfaction was provided by Ralph Dobbs, pianist, at a concert given at the High school auditorium on Friday, Jan. 18. Recently out of the armed services, Mr. Dobbs is now continuing with his third year in the music department at Willamette university. Previously he spent three seasons with Columbia Concerts and three years at Wesleyan university at Bloomington, Ill.

The concert was sponsored by the Medford High school music department, under the direction of Miss Mabel Nansen, and by the Medford Musical society.

A masterful technique was immediately displayed in Mr. Dobbs' first group of numbers, "Introduction and Fugue" by the early 18th Century composer, Vivaldi, transcribed by the contemporary Casella, and the "Handelian Rhapsody" by Scott.

But it was in the "Sonata in B Minor" by Liszt that the outstanding gifts of this artist became really apparent. Here, the desirable blending of a highly finished technique with inspiration served to make the listener conscious of hearing that rare and elusive quality known as the inevitable in his work. In any art this is an achievement. Yet often one is seen without the other—inspiration perhaps, but with fumbling technique, or a brilliant technique but with a dry-as-dust interpretation. With his sensitive phrasing, round rich tone colors, and expressive rhythms, Mr. Dobbs succeeded in convincing his audience that they were listening to music faithful to the composer himself, as it was meant to be played.

A sense of quiet grace, ease, and pure melodic beauty shone in the Brahms "Intermezzo in E Major, op. 116." In the highly emotional and a seldom-heard "Scherzo in B Minor" by Chopin was revealed an amazing flexibility and sensitive grasp of shadings varying from delicacy to force. The Debussyesque "Nocturne" by Claude Griffes, young American composer who died at a too-early age, revealed still a restraint and control of tone that produced a fragile, almost whisper-like delicacy. There was a sharply contrasting release of fire and flourish in the "Gypsy Chorus" from "Carmen" by Bizet-Moszkowski; and a colorful feeling for rhythm in the popular melody of Spain, "El Vito Variations," by the contemporary composer, Infante.

Mr. Dobbs responded with two encores, a Rubenstein transcription of the stirring "Turkish March," by Beethoven, and the popular Chopin "Polonaise," during which there was a dis-
