

LUY AND YOUNG NEW DIRECTORS ON P.C.A. BOARD

Election of Lawrence Luy, Medford, and J. E. Young, Roseburg, to the board of directors of the Southern Oregon Production Credit association was announced following a sectional meeting of the association at the Holland hotel yesterday afternoon.

The men succeed Eugene H. Fisher and James E. Conn of Roseburg whose terms expire. Officers chosen by the directors were Elmer R. Hull, Central Point, president and Raymond A. Lathrop, Grants Pass, vice president. Arthur M. Boner was retained as secretary-treasurer and Jack G. Bertrand was appointed his assistant.

270 Stockholders
Reports read at the meeting stated that the association had 270 stockholders with a \$46,115 investment at the end of 1945 and that loans for the year totaled \$751,000. Over a period of 12 years stockholders have accumulated a \$20,400 reserve.

Otto F. Allgaier, speaker from the Spokane office of the Production Credit corporation, said that the Farm Credit administration's twelfth district comprised of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana had loaned \$500,000,000 in its 12-year history and that the national total for the period was \$4,150,000,000. Losses on a national scale have been only one-seventh of one per cent.

240 Attend
Other sectional meetings were at Coquille, Tuesday, and Roseburg, Monday. Votes for directors were cast on all three occasions and totaled yesterday. Attendance for the meetings was 240 persons including stockholders and guests. Over 50 per cent of the Jackson and Josephine county stockholders registered, setting a record for the southern Oregon association. A noon luncheon was served in the Holland hotel Blue Room yesterday.

Much of the new corn crop will have to be piled on the ground, Aller believes, unless more cars are made available.
