YOU'RE TELLING ME?

I printed here the inquiry of a reader whose 12-year-old son had about a hundred warts on his hands and what to do, with the unguarded answer that I agreed with the family doctor had given—let 'em alone. As though I had any experience with human nature, I added what I meant to be a reassuring remark, namely, that "warts have a way of coming and going." I should have known better.

Yet, as write and moan and bite my knuckles here in the darkest corner of my once cheerful playroom behind a pile of letters describing absolutely positive incantations against warts I am seized with a new conviction upon opening each fifth letter, which reveals, as a precious secret, a remedy for warts that I have described in this column not less than a score of times.

A sample revelation: My boy had bad ones (warts). The principal of the school he attends told him to put castor oil on the warts, not the hands, every day. Nothing happened for a while, but in about two months they began to disappear and have not come back. No blemishes remained.

A dairyman farmer says that not merely castor oil but machine grease, axle grease and even the oil or fat butter and cheese makers handle in their work keeps the hands free from warts.

Let me state here, in self defense, that I take no stock in any treatment for warts, one or one hundred, except one or another method of surgical removal. Moreover, so far as I know, believe or imagine, the castor oil, axle grease or butter treatment is just as absurd or effective as a piece of pork stolen from your grandmother in

House Would Halt Building Addition On Truman Office

Washington, Jan. 25.—(U.P.)—The house voted tentatively today to stop a controversial new addition to the white house executive offices.

The action came in adoption of an amendment to the pending independent offices appropriation bill. Preliminary work already has begun on the addition to the white house office wing with approval of President Truman. The project has aroused opposition from civic and architectural groups, which contend it would spoil the appearance of the white house.

Portland Housing Removal Advised

Portland, Jan. 25.—(U.P.)—Mayor Earl Riley has announced that a city advisory committee on housing will soon recommend to the national housing agency the immediate removal of one-thousand of Portland's approximately 5,000 unoccupied public housing units in order to provide shelter for veterans in other Oregon and coast communities.

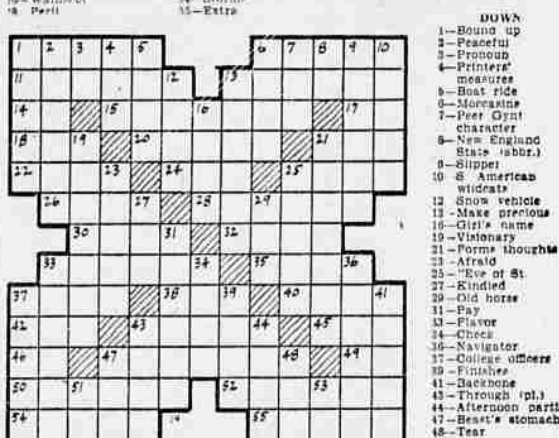
