ASHLAND ADOPTS ZONE PLAN FOR NEW INDUSTRIES

Ashland, Jan. 31 — The Ashland Zoning commission Tuesday night adopted a zoning plan for the city for presentation to the city council.

Among plans set forth in the zoning setup is the inclusion of additional areas for business and industry. The area from the railroad underpass at the north city limits to Wimer street on the east side of North Main street as well as from Helman to Morton street and from Helman to Gresham street on the west side of Main street has been designated for business purposes. Nearly all of the area immediately adjacent to A street has been set aside for industrial purposes.

Extension and widening of B street from Oak street to North Main street also was discussed. The new extension would connect at Church street with a proposed truck route through the city.

The housing situation, street paving and other subjects were discussed by the commission, headed by Chairman Earl Newberry.
