JAP INVASION MONEY INVALID IN ISLANDS
Washington, Feb. 7 — (U.P.) — President Truman today vetoed a recent act by the Philippine Commonwealth congress which would have validated payments made in Japanese invasion money while the Japanese occupied the Philippines. The president said the act would have legalized "transactions and payments made under the brutal Japanese regime, with-

out regard for the actual value of the Japanese-backed currency with which such payments were made."
