35,000 Mexicans Still in America
Mexico City, Feb. 8—(U.P.)—The labor ministry said today 11,000 Mexican day workers who went to work in the United States during the war returned to Mexico during January.

Thirty-five thousand Mexican workmen remain in the United States until May, when their work contracts expire, the ministry said.

More than 80,000 Mexican laborers went to the United States during the war and have

been returning to Mexico since the end of hostilities with Japan.
